New encased coin club founding.....A new club for encased coin collectors is being founded by Jerry Binsfeld, a collector and mail-bid dealer from Pleasant Prairie, Wis.

The new organization, called Encased Coin Collector's Klub, will be educational, non-profit and devoted to identifying mavericks and expanding the exnumia field of encased coin collecting.

Binsfeld said he believes there is a need for such a club because the field is popular to many collectors. According to Binsfeld, there may be 20,000 to 25,000 different encased coins to collect (continued on page 5)

Editor's Message

There are a large number of collectors and there are an enormous amount of encased coins just waiting to be identified, studied and appreciated. Many encased are quite rare and many are underpriced.

We can all appreciate an Unc. Encased Indian Cent, the many odd shaped cleverly done encasements and the many catchy slogans and vast variety of businesses and clubs represented. Its important that some order and direction is given to this collecting field. Hopefully ACE and its organization can bring collectors together and serve as a central source not only for information but also for buying, selling and trading.

In future issues I hope to follow the index and I especially would like to emphasize three important sections. The first is the maverick column, please read that section about how to submit. I did this for the Racine Numismatic Society when I was the editor of the Newsletter. It worked out well as long as members are willing to complete the sheet. Please keep in mind any articles should be camera ready, typed, so I can just included it in the Journal/Newsletter. I don't care to retype everything I receive for obvious reasons.

Also, I am open to suggestions on what we can include in the Journal/Newsletter. If you have any ideas or suggestions for improvements please advise.

Several collectors have asked me why I started this encased coin collectors club. My answer is that I feel a club is needed to put order into this exnumia field and to have a central source for identifying mavericks and for the additional reasons given earlier. I am also going to retire from education in three or four years and this project will structure my time. Presently, I am super busy. And finally, a selfish reason. I am putting together a book on the known encased coins in the USA by state. I recently put a Wisconsin listing together and now I am working on this larger task. I want the book to be as complete as possible. This organization will help me in this endeavor. As for making money on the book I don't think I will. I am doing it for the challenge and just to contribute to the hobby. I enjoy all areas of exnumia and have since about 1978. I got interested in the encased area in 1980 when I was offered an encased coin from Fond du Lac, Wis. and from then on I was hooked. As for the book I have had great cooperation from collectors around the U.S. I probably have about 20 collectors who took time to send me a listing of their encasements. I still could use more. If you have any please send a list my way. All contributors will be acknowledged in the book. As far as my completion date I was intending to have it complete in 1995 but because of the large number of new finds I have moved the completion date to sometime in 1997. I hope to have it in a hard cover but I have not looked into cost so this could change.

And, finally thanks for joining, hop aboard, take part, contribute and watch ACE grow.


Some of these are mavericks. An organized collector base working together could possibly identify a substantial number of these, according to Binsfeld.

PLEASE DO NOT SEND ENCASED THAT HAVE A SLIM CHANCE OF BEING ATTRIBUTED. GENERAL BUSINESS CHAINS (REXALL DRUGS, ETC.), BANKS WITH A GENERAL HEADING (FIRST FEDERAL, 50TH ANNIVERSARY, ETC.).

PACKAGE THEM SECURELY AND INCLUDE A CHECK OR STAMPS TO COVER RETURN POSTAGE AND INSURANCE INDICATING THE VALUE YOU DESIRE.

IF YOU DON'T CARE TO SEND THE ENCASED COIN(S) SEND A DESCRIPTION BUT INCLUDE ALL THE INFORMATION ON BOTH SIDES, AS WELL AS THE COMPOSITION OF THE ENCASED, SIZE, SHAPE, COIN DENOMINATION AND DATE OF COIN.

KEEP IN MIND THAT MEMBERS MAY WANT TO CONTACT THE OWNER OF A PARTICULAR PIECE. SO IF YOU WISH YOUR NAME AND ADDRESS TO APPEAR OR TO BE SHARED IF ANY INQUIRY SHOULD OCCUR INDICATE THAT AS WELL.

MAVERICKS WILL BE NUMBERED AND GROUPED WITH THE FIRST TWO LETTERS OF THE SURNAME OR MAJOR TOPIC OF THE ENCASED. IN THAT WAY EACH LETTER GROUP WILL HAVE ITS OWN SET OF NUMBERS. IN ADDITION EACH PIECE WILL BE NUMBERED ACCORDING TO THE ORDER RECEIVED. (EXAMPLE - AE - 1 (1), SO - 1 (2), AG - 1 (3), ZE - 1 (4))

A MAVERICK HAS NO INDICATION OF TOWN AND/OR STATE ON THE ENCASEMENT AND IN SOME CASES EVEN LACKS THE NAME OF THE ISSUING BUSINESS OR SUBJECT. (HOWEVER, IN ORDER TO SUBMIT FOR ATTRIBUTION THERE HAS TO BE ENOUGH CLUES FOR POSSIBLE IDENTIFICATION AND LOCATION.)

Who was Earl Fankhauser? Earl was a Fort Wayne, Indiana entrepreneur who had a side business in the 1950's and 1960's of encased coin advertising. He actively solicited businesses throughout Fort Wayne, the midwest and various other states. He was a coin collector so he had a good number of coin dealers who used the encased as a media of advertising.

A large number of pieces have his name at the bottom along with Fort Wayne, I in very small letters on the advertising side of the encasement. Most if not all of his encased are round, 32mm in size with an aluminum encasement and the slogan, "KEEP ME AND NEVER GO BROKE" (KMANGB). The inscription is located on a horseshoe with a four leaf clover below which is of several varieties.

The purchasing price for most of the Fankhauser pieces are from \$2.00 to \$20.00 pending town, topic and denomination of the encased coin. As for denomination Fankhauser allegedly produced a gold-colored 25 cent encasement, (however I have never encountered one nor do I know of anyone who has) a Canadian cent encasement, a U.S. nickel and a U.S. dime encasement. Other than that the 600 plus that he had produced were all encased Lincoln cents.

Recently I purchased a Fankhauser piece with a 1961 Panama one centesimo encased with the advertising of the Roses/Harvey & Patsy/Box 577 La Mesa, Calif. (pictured). It appears to be a specimen that was in the initial run for it has no tool marks or looseness at the point of attachment between the coin and the encasement. The coin may have been in a batch of Lincoln cents that were being encased and was inadvertently done or a group were purposely encased. I am not sure which nor do I have any figures on the mintage. The Roses were coin dealers.

The condition of many of the Fankhauser pieces are in the AU/Une category. Most seem to be plentiful so I am guessing he probably had 1000 plus made for each client. But again, I have never seen any mintage figures so this is a guess.
