Editor's Comments

We are up to 58 members which surpasses the goal set in the summer of 1995. The enthusiasm and camaraderie shown by members via phone calls and mail is most gratifying.

Starting with the next Journal/newsletter a new feature is being offered and that is a club auction. This will be run somewhat like the Civil War Token Society auction but instead of Civil War tokens ACE will of course deal with encased coins. Members can send one to a hundred encased coins for each auction. There will be no charge for this other than the ACE consignor must pay postage and insurance for the return of any unsold lots. See below for a complete run down of rules. Keep in mind that they are subject to change, revisions and additions as we carry out future sales and find areas that need to be addressed.

And finally Joel Reznick will have his National Collectible Show March 9 - 10, 1996 at the Holiday Inn-Elk Grove, Ill., 1000 Busse Road at Landmeier, Sat. 9-6 and Sunday 10 - 4. This is very near O'Hare Airport, Chicago. If you can make it do so because its a great show. On Sat. March 9 at 1:00 p.m. we will hold a general meeting of ACE. It will be our first annual meeting. It will be held at the Holiday Inn and the place will be announced at the show. Look for a poster near the registration table. Bring your extras to trade and sell. Meet some of your fellow members. Share your ideas as to what we can do to improve ACE. All are invited to attend especially the Board of Governors -John Wilson, Roger Winkelhake, Joel Reznick and new member Steve Drake. If you can't because of distance and or time that's OK too. I will seek board of governor input via mail and share the minutes in the next newsletter/journal.

Thanks to all that sent information on collector profile. This feature will start in the next issue.

Club auction rules: Members can submit anywhere from one to 100 encased coins which will be sold to the highest bidder. Minimum bids are \$1.50 per lot unless otherwise indicated. Members should attribute and grade or auction manager will do so. (Yours truly) Lots should be received at least 3 weeks before issue date. Closing date will be the last day of the issue month or a deadline indicated. Mail bids only. Paid advertising for price list, mail bids will still be accepted.

Some general rules-

1. Send bids to Jerry Binsfeld, Box 191, Pleasant Prairie, WI 53158
2. All encased have been attributed by members. Lots incorrectly attributed or described may be returned within 7 days of receipt of lots. Reason for return must accompany lots.
3. Bids are to be made by lot number only. Earliest postmark will decide tie bids.
4. Bids of \$10. or more will be reduced to 10% over the second highest bid, or 50% of the bid, whichever is larger. Bids less than \$10. will not be reduced.
5. Terms are cash/personal check. Lots will be shipped by U.S. Mail unless otherwise requested. Bidders will pay postage and insurance. Payment is due and payable upon receipt of billing.
6. Auction manager reserves the right to reject any bid or withdraw any lot.
7. All encased are aluminum unless otherwise indicated. Shape, grade, date and denomination, complete information on both obv. and rev. and any glaring flaws are denoted.
8. Abbreviations will be used where possible.
9. Two grades indicate the encasement and the coin. The coin grade will follow the date of the coin. The encasement grade will follow the shape. One grade will indicate both are the same.
10. Prices realized will be available after the close of the auction and will be sent free to all bidders who have won lots. Others requesting the prices realized list must send a self-addressed stamped envelope (SASE) with the request.

Auction rules continued..

11. Please observe a minimum bid of \$1.50 per lot unless otherwise indicated in parentheses () following the lot description. This is a general minimum for the auction, and does not imply the value of any lot in the auction. Bid responsibly.
12. There is no commission charge to consignors. Consignors will get paid within 30 days or less after closing. Terms of auction sales were patterned after the CWTS auction. (Dale Cade)

value—difficult to ascertain, condition, age, subject matter, shape, location, number available, coin denomination, and generally it comes down to what someone is willing to pay

Olson/Twenty Years Loyal And Faithful Service. The encasement is 14K gold, 2.52 oz. The piece sold for \$700.00 Most likely the only one of its kind. The last time this fob was for sale was in 1992.

When attributing mavericks please indicate reference source if known and indicate the number assigned and name of encasement to avoid errors.

Mavericks

Members are encouraged to send encased mavericks to the editor but not more than 50 at a time. Please do not send encased that have a slim chance of being attributed. General business chains, banks with generic headings etc.

When sending your list of mavericks send a description and include all information on both sides, as well as the composition of the encased, size, shape, coin denomination and date of coin. If you don't care to send the list you may send them. Package securely and include a check or stamps to cover return postage and insurance indicating the value you desire.

Keep in mind that members may want to contact the owner of a particular piece. So if you wish your name and address to appear or to be shared if any inquiry should occur indicate that as well.

Mavericks are numbered and grouped with the first two letters of the surname or major topic. Each letter group will have its own set of numbers and each piece will also be numbered according to the order received.

A maverick has no indication of town and/or state on the encasement and in some cases even lacks the name of the issuing business or subject. However, in order to submit for attribution there has to be enough clues for possible identification and location.

"Thanks for starting the ACE. I think you asked for lists of encased cent collections -- I enclose my list. I am sure that my descriptions are longer than they need be and do not correspond with normal lingo. I hope this helps you in writing a book about encased coins.

I have a number of questions about encased cents. There does not seem to be any reference book about them. Do you know of any book about encased cents that would explain more about their history and how they were produced and given out? I really do not want a price guide -- I enjoy being able to buy encased cents for what I want to pay without being told what they are "worth" by someone who might not even know.

I am thinking about writing an article about 1901 Pan Am Exposition encased cents. Would the Casement be interested in such an article. I have been reading all the books about the exposition that I can find in Cleveland. So far I have found no specific reference to encased cents as souvenirs. Do you know anything about how the encased cents were made for the exposition, how they were given out and why there are so many types, including minor variations of the same type?

I have been looking to buy encased cents for about two years and it seems to be that the Pan American Exposition encased are the most common Indian encased available. Do you think that is true or is my world skewed going to shows somewhat near Buffalo. I think I have seen at least 10 different samples of the common 38mm circular Pan American encased, which is a lot. Someone else told me that they are really scarce, as are all Indian encased. "

That's what ACE is for and that is to add to the hobby and to help make others more knowledgeable.

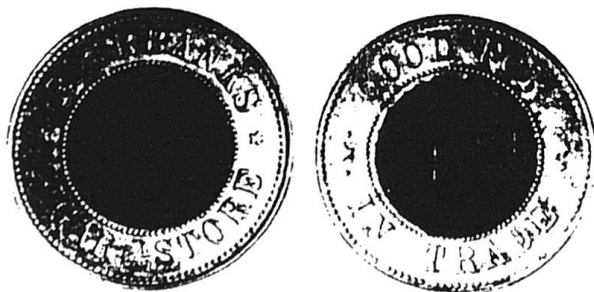

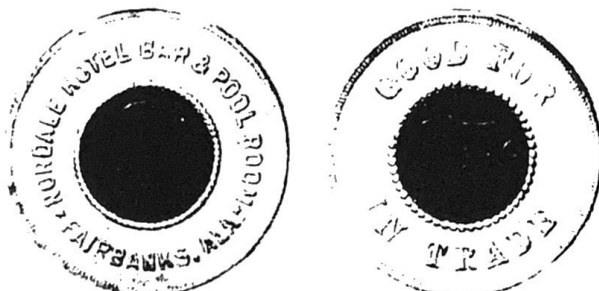
Is it time for a rarity scale? Could ACE use the rarity numbers with a couple of changes from the scale compiled by Dr. Sheldon in his books "Early American Cents" and "Penny Whimsy". This method of listing rarities has proved very successful with both Civil War tokens and Alaska tokens. In the book put out by Ken Bressett, Maurice M. Gould and Kaye and Nancy Dethridge, titled, "Alaska's Coinage Through The Years" the following scale was used. The numbers in parenthesis were added.

R8 1 to 3 known	R4 76 to 200 known
R7 4 to 12 known	R3 Scarce (201 - 350 known)
R6 13 to 30 known	R2 Not so common (351 - 551 known)
R5 31 to 75 known	R1 Common (552 and over)

The Chevrolet Advertising Campaign Of 1948

by Joel J. Reznick

After collecting encased coins for about six or seven years, I began to notice that there occurred more than a usual number of Chevrolet pieces with 1947 or 1948 dates. One day I obtained a piece that kind of fit all the pieces together — it said CHEVY'S GOT IT - S.A. Thinking back to my youth, I recalled an advertising campaign shortly after the War which stated "Chevy's Got It - S.A." Of course, in the 1940s one did not allude in print to "Sex Appeal" — violal — "S.A."

After some discussions with my good friend and fellow collector, Jim Hemphill, I came to the conclusion that the Chevrolet Motor Division of General Motors had indeed run an ad campaign in 1948, perhaps to herald the new body design that arrived in the fall. (The 1949 Chevy did have a new and radical body style; low and well, sexy!) I began to search for these pieces in earnest, and, fortunately, began to find them. They represented every small town in the United States, some of which I had never heard of and some I couldn't believe. Jim and I have now amassed

a list of almost 500 different, of which I personally own over 200.

I contacted the Chevrolet Hobby Shop, which is a part of their Customer Assistance Dept. They had never head of the program! I sent them some examples for reference and hope to hear from them one of these days. All this notwithstanding, I'm convinced the ad program did exist.

The pieces were all produced by five or six different encasers (we have found 5-6 different die formats), probably on a regional basis. Almost all were encased in aluminum, although we know of three with red plastic rings; the dies on these are congruent with the others. Jim and I think there might be as many as 1200 different. If you have any in your collection which are not included in the following list, please make a rubbing or put down all of the information that appears on the obverse (where the dealer's name is) and send it to Jim Hemphill, P.O. Box 1321, Lake Oswego, OR 97035. As the list grows, we'll try to have it printed from time to time.
