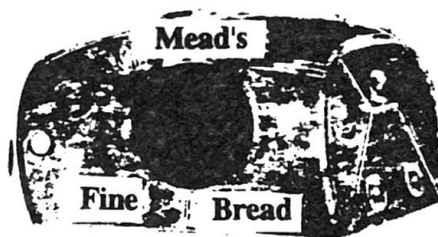

**New Maverick Listing**

Members are encouraged to send encased mavericks to the editor but not more than 50 at a time. Please do not send encased that have a slim chance of being attributed. General business chains, banks, with generic headings, etc. However, business chains can be sent where there is a chance of a home office, in a case like this the State and city of the home office could be considered the place for attribution.

When sending your list of mavericks send a description and include all information on both sides, as well as the composition of the encased, size, shape, coin denomination and date of coin. If you don't care to send the list you may send the encasements. Package securely and include a check or stamps to cover return postage and insurance indicating the value you desire.

Keep in mind that members may want to contact the owner of a particular piece. So if you want your name and address to appear or to be shared if any inquiry should occur indicate that as well. Several ACE members have inquired about wanting to buy, sometimes owner is unknown or I didn't keep a record of ownership or the piece is not for sale so a no reply indicates one of the above.

Mavericks are numbered and grouped with the first two letters of the surname or major topic. Each letter group will have its own set of numbers and each piece will also be numbered according to the order received.

A maverick has no indication of town and/or state on the encasement and in some cases even lacks the name of the issuing business or subject.

**FOLLOW UP ARTICLE ON THE ENCASED CENTS OF THE 1901 PAN-AMERICAN  
EXPOSITION BY JAMES M. LAWNICZAK (ACE #21) P.O. BOX 14465  
CLEVELAND, OHIO 44114**

The answer to the elephant question is that nothing happened. An elephant's hide has the effect of rubber and therefore will not conduct electricity -- an elephant will not die of a lightning strike. Poor Frank Bostock had to refund all tickets, costing him about \$3500, quite a tidy sum in those days.

No one submitted an entry in the contest. I have had a couple contacts with members, but could certainly use more information. Come on guys, if we are going to put together a list of all the thousands of encased out there, we are going to have to work together. I appreciate all correspondence and will respond -- send me samples, even if you think I have seen them. That way, I can get a good idea of rarity and report to you on it in the future.

However, the article did seem somewhat timely. In the May '96 issue of the Casement, there was the report from member John Zelonis on a Pan Am encasement, which is now Pae-8b. In addition, in the May '96 ACE auction, there were three examples of Pae-1, which I had called the most common of the Pae encased, and probably the most common Indian encased.

The prices of encased seem to have gone up somewhat from early in the year when my article was written. Common Indian encased seem to be selling for around \$30 now, as opposed to \$20 then. If you really want a Pae piece, I suggest you will now have to pay nearer the top of the listed price range. I suspect that the forming of this ACE club had a lot to do with that.

In any event, through contacts with the Pan-American Expo Collectors Society in New York, auction catalogs and new items seen, I have identified quite a few additional varieties of Pan Am Expo encased. It was pointed out to me that the PAE designation could cause confusion with Pan American Exposition elongated cents, which have already been cataloged. Therefore, I decided to use lower case for the "Pae" encased to try to differentiate the numbering system from the PAE elongated numbers.

Pae-1. It was noted that most of the Pae-1s have the words "Pat. Appl. For" on the reverse in one of the horseshoes.



I have now seen two and heard of two others that have the words "Pat. Apr. 23, 1901," both on -1a (stem left) varieties. This probably means that the -1b variety came first. I checked all the patents issued on April 23, 1901 and none of them appeared to me to be at all related to encased. I do not believe that the change in the patent information on the reverse is sufficient to warrant yet another variety of Pae-1. There are also some other minor variations on exactly where the stem points to and how long it is, but I also do not believe there is enough difference there to warrant another variety either.

Pae-2. I am told that there is a variation of the running buffalo encased with "Souvenir of Our Fair/ 1901" instead of "Pan American Exposition." It has been speculated that this may have been a generic encased produced for any 1901 fair (state or county). I have never seen it, however. I would appreciate anyone sending me an example.

Pae-3. My article comparing Pae-3 and -6 has the cent the wrong way in the Pae-3 encasement. I knew my Pae-3 cent had been popped out and replaced, but I had mistakenly assumed that the realignment was original. However, I have now seen the original version. It is the cent's reverse that is on the side with the picture of the Buffalo. By the way, be very careful. I have seen quite a few punched out and replaced cents recently -- up to about 30% of the Pan-American encased that I see. An encasement with a replaced coin has substantially less value. Look carefully to see if there is any room between the cent and the encasement (put a light source behind the encasement) and compare the condition of the coin to the encasement. On Pae-1, for example, the cuts on the rim should exactly match the clovers and the clover stem.

Pae-4. There are actually two varieties of Pae-4. The two clovers on the obverse are larger on the -4a variety than they are on the -4b variety. In addition, the -4a variety has two additional, smaller clovers next to the words Exposition and N.Y., which are lacking on the -4b. On the reverse, the -4a variety has the words "I Bring Good Luck," while the -4b variety has the words "Save Me and Have Good Luck." Apparently, some of the -4a variety has the words "Pat. appld. for" on the reverse and some do not. Again, not enough of a difference to warrant a new variety.

Pae-5. There are also two varieties of Pae-5. The reverse of -5a has two wishbones superimposed, while the reverse of -5b has only one. Russell Sage's Lucky Penny, which I bought in the August ACE auction, is identical (except for the words) with Pae-5a.

Pae-6. I did note something on my Pae-6 piece not reported originally. At the bottom of the obverse of the piece it is noted that a patent has been applied for. Then below that is "Whitehead & Hoag Co. Newark," the manufacturer. The name Whitehead & Hoag appears on several other pieces. Coincidentally, I was looking at the June 1977 article of the Numismatist and noticed in an article about Admiral Dewey Advertising Cards, which came out around the turn of the century, that Whitehead & Hoag Co. was identified as the manufacturer of the majority of the Dewey advertising cards. There was also a recent article on the Dewey tokens in the July 22, 1996 issue of Coin World. Finally, there is a very interesting Whitehead & Hoag encased, also with a 1901 cent. It is wishbone shaped, similar to Pae-3 and -6 (the good luck wording is a bit different) and says "The Whitehead & Hoag Co. Makers of Advertising Novelties With Merit Newark N J USA."

Pae-7. The other side of this item (the dustpan) has a large Buffalo around the cent and the words "I Was at" above the Buffalo and "1901" below. I am not certain which way the cent is oriented in the encasement as I have seen two pictures: on one the cent's obverse was in the dustpan, on the other the obverse was in the Buffalo. I suspect, but do not know, that the obverse in the dustpan is the original.

Pae-8. As I suspected, the round plastic Pae-8 is part of a fairly large set. Call the one I identified in the original article with the Triumphal Arch on the back -8a. The one I have is blue around the rims, another is white, but that is not enough of a difference to be a separate variety. 8b is the encased identified by John Zelonis in the May '96 issue of the Casement and has an orange border and the Temple of Music pictured on the back. 8c is also orange with the Government Bldg. pictured. 8d is red with the words "You've Got to Show Me/ I'm from Missouri/ Pan American Buffalo" on the back. 8e is dark green with the words "Where Does Grass Grow?/ In Mexico Your Buffalo Put Me Off/ Pan American Expo" on the back. 8f is green, with a "Night View of Tower" (the Electrical Tower) on the reverse. 8g has the words on the reverse: "Oh Fudge Forget it/ Perhaps Tain't True/ Put Me Off at Buffalo." An interesting set, and I am sure there are still more.

Pae-9. There are at least two examples of this encased token in existence. Based on the only sale I have seen, at which I was again the underbidder, I would say this is worth \$130-\$200.

I have been pointed to many new types of Pan Am Encased not identified in my original article.

OH-CLE-Pae-10 is an interesting piece. It is round, 38mm. The obverse has the coin's reverse and has the word "North" in large letters at the top. Then on the bottom, it says "Cleveland O, USA Pan-American Souvenir." On the reverse are the words "Good Luck, Keep Me and Prosper," along with a wishbone, a horseshoe and a four leaf clover. This piece has sold at two auctions this year, and I have been the underbidder on both. Value \$80-\$110.

NY-BUF-Pae-11 is round, 38mm, with a 1901 British farthing encased. The obverse has two clasped hands at the top. In small letters, it says: "Uncle Sam Ould Granu/ Pan-American/ Lucky Pocket Piece/ Buffalo N.Y./ 1901." All the writing on the reverse is in Gaelic. Cost \$30-60. This piece has "W & H Newark NJ" at the bottom of the reverse.

(NY)-BUF-Pae-12 is round, 36mm. The obverse says "Use Easybright Polishes, Pan American Buffalo 1901, Don't Lose Me." The reverse says "Keep Me and Never Go Broke, Rec'd Trade Mark, I bring Good Luck." I cannot comment on what this might be worth, as I know of no sales. Apparently, this has a variety, too, like Pae-2, with "Souvenir of Our Fair/ 1901" substituted for the Pan American Exposition.

NY-BUF-Pae-13 is round, 32mm, with the cent off center towards the bottom. The obverse says "Pan-American Exposition, Buffalo NY, Good Luck." The reverse has pictures of a clover, horseshoe and wishbone and also says "Good Luck." Some of the pieces have "W & H Co., Newark NJ" on them and others do not -- not enough of a difference to warrant a separate variety in my opinion. W & H is, of course, Whitehead and Hoag. This should sell for around \$20-\$40.

(NY)-BUF-Pae-14 is the frying pan encased. A 1901 Indian cent is set into a small frying pan. On the handle of the obverse is "Buffalo," the reverse "I'm it." The obverse of the pan says "Pan American/ Lucky Penny," the reverse "Buffalo Exposition/ 1901" The handle has a hole and a stickpin is in it. This is a true encased with the cent manufactured into the piece, showing through on both sides. A very interesting piece. The handle is very fragile and is broken off on many specimens. In addition, the pin might be missing. An example with an original handle and a pin would sell for between \$90 and \$125.

NY-BUF-Pae-15 is round, 38mm. An animal's head (probably a cow) is at the top, with a wreathlike design coming out of it. "PAN

AMERICAN EXHIBITION/ SOUVENIR/ BUFFALO, N.Y." On the reverse, two horns of plenty are at the top. "GOOD LUCK AND PROSPERITY." Cost is \$25 to \$40.

NY-BUF-Pae-16 is round, 38mm. On the obverse, there are five balloon shapes around the cent, with the words "20th Century Penny/ From the/ grounds of the/ Pan American/ Exposition 1901/ Buffalo." "W & H Co Newark N J is at the bottom." The reverse (cent obverse) have a clover, horseshoe and wishbone and says "Keep Me and Prosper." I have not seen any sales of this one either.

I have seen two merchant tokens that may have been given out at the 1901 exposition, but I have no proof.

Pae-M1 is wishbone shaped, like Pae-3 and -6, but holed at the top. "Schwarzschild & Sulzberger Co/ Beef and Pork Packers/ Chicago/ Kansas City/ New York." The reverse is identical to Pae-3. Cost \$30-\$45. The members of the Pan American Expo Collectors Society tell me that Schwarzschild & Sulzberger had an exhibit at the expo.

Pae-M2 is round, 38mm. National Lead Co./ Anti Friction Babbitt Metals/ Perfection. Cost \$25-\$40.

Thanks to Fred Lavin and Ron Gorkiewicz of the Pan-American Expo Collectors Society, and Bob Slawsky and John Zelonis for providing information and copies of Pan Am encased for this series.
