Re Nov 97, page 7 "new shape identified" segment concerning Bill Koponen's "cocktail glass shaped encasement."

It is not a "new shaped identified" and the 1929 Lincoln cent is replaced!

The so-called "cocktail glass" is in fact a goblet shape, long known and catalogued well over a decade ago more than once in Gaylor Lipscomb's thick Ohio token reference, now published in the 2nd Edition! Lipscomb lists at least (2) different "goblet-shaped encasements."

For the past several years I've advertised for "goblet shaped" encasements.

They are rare, but not extremely so. There are probably 5-6 different goblet encasements. I own (3) of which one is a Kentucky saloon good-for, of at least 2 are known.

How do I know Bill Koponen's "cocktail glass" encasement has a replaced 1929 cent? Because all known goblets

have encased Indian Head cents and I own Koponen's Metropolitan Silbert goblet (Cincinnati, Ohio) with an uncirculated 1901 Indian cent.

Sorry to be so sarcastic but the "announcement" on page 7 just lacked so much knowledge.

New shape identified

Several issues ago all the known shapes of encasements that I was familiar with were listed. As I was made aware of others we listed them. The latest, from Michael S. Macuga who writes: I just purchased a "new" shaped encasement that was not listed in The Casement to date. I bought it from Paul Koppenhaver from California. In a mail bid that he had in the TACT auction put out by ACE member Dick Grinolds. The new encasement is a 1908 Indian cent encased in aluminum in the shape of a barrel. It is 39mm high and 33mm wide. The obverse says: A BARREL FULL OF MONEY/ (Coin) I BRING GOOD LUCK The reverse says: SOUVENIR/ OF (coin)/NIAGARA FALLS On the obverse it even has the barrel bands or stays in the encasement. The overall grade is AU, it also came with a small manila envelope that had written on it "From mom and dad, Souvenir of Niagara Falls 1908" a neat new piece for my collection.

Viewpoint and a Observation

It seems as if some of the prices in the ACE auction are firming up. I seem to be buying less and less at my normal bid prices. Enclosed is an uncirculated 1953-D Fankhauser (IN)-(FWA)-WA-20, which is the pun encased. This is a donation to the ACE auction, proceeds to go to the ACE.

I noticed something interesting recently while looking through my Fankhauser encased. On the reverse (cent obverse) of quite a few from 1960 and some 1961 and 1962 there is either a glob of extra aluminum metal just where the encasement meets the cent at around 8 or 9:00 (exact position varies) or a gouge in the cent. I have seen it on at least 20 examples, such as IN-AND-WO-10A. Not all 1960 Fankhausers have this, but it is more common than not for that year. For 1961 and after it is less common. There is still some on some 1963 and 1964 pieces (OH-CLE-HA-10). Something was happening with the dies that Osborne was using around this time. I have a non-Fankhauser piece (Norm Hansen Marine/239 So. St. Clair St./ Boats-Ch. 3 6551 - Motors, which the seller told me was from Toledo, Ohio, although I have not verified that). It has a 1960-D cent and there is just a trace of extra aluminum (and lots of die polishing) in the proper area. This should identify the Norm Hansen piece as an Osborne piece.

And finally, is there any thought that we will have life memberships?

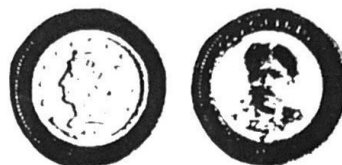

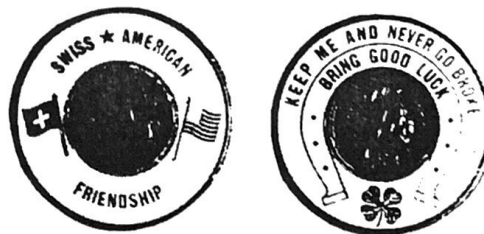

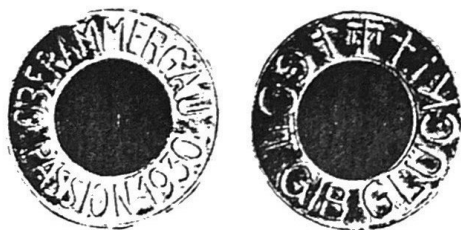

Member Profile

Meet Jim Hemphill, (ACE #3), extraordinary collector/writer. Jim resides with his wife of 43 years in Lake Oswego, Oregon. They have two children and Jim is retired and has been for the last eight years from an accounting position at a Traffic Management Office.

Jim is a Navy veteran and served in W. W. II as a petty officer, 3rd class, and then during the Korean Conflict served in the Air Force as a Staff Sergeant. As to why he served in two major military conflicts Jim replied with a laugh, "I guess I was Patriotic".

Mr. Hemphill grew up in Nebraska and graduated from Gresham H.S. where he played football, basketball and track. He then went to college, first at York College and then finishing at Lincoln College where he continued to participate in football and track.

The ACE member is considered a true collector for he has specialized through the years in no less than 38 areas of exonomia. Jim also collects Canadian coins and has for forty some years. Along with these areas he also collects pre-canceled stamps. He estimates that he probably has one of the larger collections in the nation in terms of numbers. "I could be busy until the turn of the century just with stamps, I have a milk can full that have to be cataloged and placed in some kind of proper order."

Jim has written the Oregon Good For Token Book. He started this endeavor in 1985 after an advanced collector gave him an inventory of his holdings. He combined that inventory with the sizeable collection he had and he was on his way. He then added to this listing by what Terry Trantow had which was a very large collection. According to Jim, Terry had his inventory of Oregon Good Fors on 3 x 5" index cards which measured six feet long. He then added to the book's numbers by getting additional contributions from about 50 additional members. In some cases that meant traveling to California and various destinations in Oregon. Along with the listings all

the known good fors were checked for rarity. Lists were made to determine who had what. A rarity scale then was developed and this then was included in Jim's work.

Mr. Hemphill would like other guys to develop books for their states. "There are a good number of states that still must be done and of course if they are, rarity should be included."

When asked if he was planning a second edition, the first was completed in 1992, Jim answered, "most likely not, putting together a token book takes a tremendous amount of time, its a labor of love with little or no monetary gain. I have an additional 1000 Good Fors not listed in the first edition so a supplement is a strong possibility."

The ACE #3 member is also the secretary for the AVA (American Venturist Association) which is an organization devoted to fare and toll tokens, automobile parking tokens and automobile washing tokens. Jim does some writing for their journal, he catalogs all new personal member tokens and shares these with over 225 members. He also served the organization as president and had a four year term. He enjoys meeting members at their yearly National Show which meets each year in a different part of the country. In fact, his friendship with the "Head Frog" Joel Reznick started at a Utah convention back in the early 70's.

Mr. Hemphill also attends many of the larger coin shows,

collectible shows, flea markets and he visits coin shops. He like most exonomia collectors is always looking for desirable pieces. One of his better finds was a token from Scholls, Oregon which may be the only one that exists. This he bought from a flea market dealer.

Jim says he is always checking two good sources, NATCO and TACT which have plenty of mail bid offerings for additions to his collection.

Jim was asked about his library and he replied that he buys every new token book that comes out. He has two shelves full. He also belongs to TAMS and receives their journal.

Mr. Hemphill had an extensive encased collection from both Oregon and Nebraska. Just last year he sold both via a mail bid. He is down sizing and is reducing certain categories of his many collections and encased was one of them. He stated he wished he had another encased collection to sell. His top price was for a chamber pot from Independence, Oregon which was from a harness and horse jewelry dealer. It brought \$300. and two encased V-nickels brought over \$200. Some however brought only \$2 or \$3.

Jim still collects encased that have a good for theme. He also actively buys good for tokens with 2 1/2 cent or 7 1/2 cent values. He also collects Snooker tokens which were popular in the 1940's. Snooker is a game like pool.

The Oregon collector started collecting encased in about 1975 and remembers paying \$2 to \$4 for most but exhibition pieces like Lewis & Clark sold for \$15. and up. In 1975 he received a

small collection of coins and tokens from his father and one of the tokens was a Cranston Chevy encased cent from Boise, Idaho. This was where his father worked and the piece caught his attention and thats really what started him in pursuing not only encased but encased Chevy pieces. Jim began to compile a list and if he found a Chevy piece from his two states he would add it to his collection and if it was from another state then he would sell it to Joel. Through the years the Chevy list grew and what has been published in TAMS and in The Casement is the result of the effort.

Jim feels that the direction of the hobby is good. However, the supply is drying up somewhat due to more collectors and to some hoarding.

Jim donated a large collection of black and white pictures to ACE which shows all the known Good Luck slogans and known reverses of encased coins. Arnie Slaybough took the pictures, he then gave them to Joel Reznick, who gave them to Jim, who in turn gave them to ACE. (Thanks fellows)

And finally, it was a joy to converse with Jim Hemphill, truly a gentlemen first and a collector second. Obviously, Jim is very knowledgeable in the hobby and what makes it so nice he is willing to share that knowledge with others. This is what it is all about. ACE wishes to thank him for taking time to share once again with his fellow ACE members.

Jim, may you continue to add to your Oregon holdings and may you continue to enjoy the hobby of encased and token collecting. thank you, jb
