#### Editor's Message

Hello again from Wisconsin. All is well in the hobby of encased. Prices still seem to be moving up, especially for desirable encased, better Indian cents and unusual shapes. Common ones such as coin clubs and Rexall Drug etc. are even getting \$2.00 bids. Jim Lawnizak's article contained within this issue deals with this timely subject of prices. Be sure to check it out.

Starting with this issue and continuing for a good number of future issues we will list all the known encased from two to six states. The listing will be as complete as possible, including all what the state cataloger has and all that are in the ACE pool. ACE members then can help in the following three ways. First, look over the listing and check off what you own. Then, let the state cataloger or the editor know. In this way we will have somewhat of an idea as to popularity. Second, look over the listing and if there are any errors make corrections and add any missing words. Often the list of known encased revolves around personal collections and from previous mail bids and sale catalogs. The description in these catalogs often times are

abbreviated ending up that way on master lists. And third, send any additions and additional known dates. Most lists are 50 to 60 percent complete. Additions should be described fully, including the slogan side, Keep Me...etc., shape, date and type of coin and make-up of the encasement, aluminum, plastic or whatever should be included.

As you can see the listing of all known encased will truly be an ACE project. Incidentally, this idea was discussed and approved at the Milwaukee Central States ACE meeting. Speaking about meetings check out Mike Macuga's memo. He plans to have an ACE meeting in the Boston area. Time, date and location are covered in Mike's letter and is published elsewhere in this issue.

It appears now that there will be three different soft covered books listing all the known encased. The states will be grouped into thirds by alphabetical order. In Issue 12, Alaska, Hawaii and Iowa are featured. Last we heard all are great states and all are listed second on most everyones popularity list, Wisconsin of course being first. Alaska has very few known encased, at least by me. ACE contributions are sorely needed. Hawaii is limited

as well. All the encased listed come from Metcalf's book and are listed as they appear in his book. The lowa list is from Steve Drakes efforts. Corrections, additions and popularity can be sent to Steve. His address is given by the lowa list.

After the soft covered books are published and the newly found errors are corrected and additions are added then a one volume book will be forthcoming.

The next issue (13) will list known encased from Florida, Georgia (A good number of these will come from Randy Partin's list), Delaware, District of Columbia and Kansas As you can see the book idea is slowly becoming a reality. But, again, realize we need ACE member contribution. A summary of what states will be included in what quarterly newsletter/journal is listed elsewhere in this issue.

Larry Oller just sent ACE a 20 page list of known Kansas encased as well as a pretty good number of other state encasements. A special thanks to Larry and to all the other collectors who have sent lists. We also want to thank all those who will contribute in the future.

Keep the maverick list coming in and also feel free to

send your extras for the club auction. Thanks to the head frog, Joel Reznick, Al Zaika and others for Mav ID's.

"George Hosek has just published another work in his series dealing with Midwestern trade tokens. This particular volume deals specifically with the attribution of Nebraska state trade token mavericks. The book is printed in the 8 1/2" X 11" full size format on medium grade

stock and is spiral bound with card covers. Print reproduction quality is clear and the type style and size chosen makes for easy scanning during reference work.

The author through many years work on his own and with the help of over 40 other collectors has compiled the most extensive listing of Nebraska trade token mavericks available. Over 3700 different entries are cataloged by business location. It must be noted that this work is not a detailed listing catalog of each token, rather a locator only. Detailed descriptions of the tokens are omitted as are size, rarity and composition information.

The work is divided into three sections. The first is the listing of the tokens alphabetically by merchant name. A brief description is given along with the city location and years of operation if known. The second section is the listing organized alphabetically by city name with the same description data given. The third section is of special interest to topical billiard hall & saloon collectors. It is a ten-page listing transferred from the 1911-12 Nebraska Directory of all known billiard halls and saloons.

This new work will be especially useful to the Nebraska collector and to the segment of our hobby that enjoys the research and location of those elusive maverick tokens.

There is a new subvariety to Pae-4, which is the "I am Your Mascot" variety, which will be NY-BUF-Pae-4c. This piece combines the obverse that is -4a (with the two large clovers and the two very small clovers) with the reverse to the Pae-1. It was found by ACE member Chuck Berger of Omaha, Nebraska who lent it to me to establish as a new subvariety. He owns the only known to me example of this piece.

There is also a completely new seventeenth variety, the (NY)-BUF-Pae-17. It is a Frying Pan with approximate dimensions 40mm X 70mm, with a stickpin in the end of the handle. On the handle is the word Souvenir. Inside the pan are the words. Pan-American Exposition /Buffalo. The cent is not struck into the encasement (as on the frying pan encased Pae-14) but rather is placed into a hole and fixed in with four short metal tabs. There is no writing on the reverse, instead the lettering from the obverse shows through, and the cent can be partially seen through four small holes. I saw this one in the recent auction of Bob Moffatt of Massachusetts.

You will find the state and city columns very helpful to sort by when you set up the catalog numbers. Especially since when you put mavericks in parenthesis, it makes it so you can't just sort on the catalog number in the computer.

You will need to assign reverse numbers to each reverse style, and then just put the number of the reverse in the listing. The first letter of the reverse number indicates the shape (R=round, B=bell, T=teddy bear, H=horseshoe,....) You should include a picture of each in the catalog if you can.

Same thing for "signature numbers". Just include a key of the various wordings (it's more than just Fankhauser pieces that have "signatures" along the bottom edge in tiny letters) and give each one a number for reference in the listing. The wording on the bottom is part of the description of the piece, and can make an interesting study.

I would not worry too much if your first version of your book does not have complete information on every piece (reverse pictures, signature descriptions,....). The important thing is to have a column for the information, so when it is known there is some place to record it.

Again, if you send me the information you already have on disc, I can fit it into this format.

Then going forward it should be much easier to keep it all organized.

Look again at my catalog of Fankhauser pieces to see how it might all come together in the end. After struggling with many different formats, I think what I ended up with came out very clear and easy to read and use, both for me and for collectors.

I would suggest you forward this blank spreadsheet to each state cataloger. If they need help transitioning into the "standard" format, I can help (if they have it on disc). Once everyone is doing it the same, it should get much better.

#### Encased Pricing by Jim Lawniczak

I have heard from several new and non-members that they really do not have any idea about pricing of encased cents. I have seen several auctions on the Internet recently (E-Bay) which show that some buyers don't know either. So, I thought I'd share a little of my experience with you to help you out, as there are no price guides for encased.

The following is a fair rough indication of current pricing for problem free identifiable encased in the EF range - - Indian cents: \$20 to \$35 (though it is getting harder to find any for \$20 anymore); 1910s: \$10 to \$20; 1920s: \$8 to \$15; 1930s:\$6 to \$12: 1940s: \$5 to \$10; 1950s: \$3 to \$8; and modern issues: \$1.50 to \$5. Add \$5 to \$10 for 1910-1930 mintmarks, or other less common dates. Common Fankhausers go for \$2 to \$4 for nice original or near original specimens. However, adjustments must be made downward for items that are very common and upward for items which are rarer or more desirable or both. Some adjustments need common sense -- I've never seen a 1914D encased (or a 1909S VDB for that matter) but my guess is that an original one would fetch a nice price.

The downward adjustments for very common pieces would include in my opinion: the Souvenir of Washington series (I believe these were available for years at the base of the Washington Monument); the Souvenir of Niagara Falls series; the common New York Stork Club pieces (these include the off

center cent and the 1939 New York World's Fair); and some other pieces which are extremely common, including 1946 ARCH Snyder Beaver County, PA.; and 1972 Theron's Country Store, Columbiana, O. There is a substantial discount for stock pieces (which were used as samples and have no advertising or event). Mavericks are a bit lower, but not as much as you might expect. Adjustments must also be made for condition.

Upward adjustments are usually based on desirability of the piece. Examples include: the 1948 Chevrolet series, which adds about \$5 to value; shapes (even horseshoes are worth just a bit more than round, with unusual shapes such as teddy bears, the goblets, a shirt, a Niagara Falls barrel and the like commanding very high prices); things people are interested in like railroads and bars and sports; rare states like Wyoming, Alaska and Hawaii; and don't forget adjustment due to nice condition.

## Encased Silver Dollar and Cast Varieties by Jerry Binsfeld

At the Central States Spring Show I found four encased dollars that were being offered for sale. I ended up buying one. The price for the one piece seemed reasonable. Most if not all encased dollars are rare and do command prices in the \$50 to \$125 price range. The encased I bought was a 1921 Morgan dollar encased in black plastic with white letters that reads, 1939 Silver Anniversary 1964

Consolidated Foods Corporation This around the dollar on the obverse. The reverse is solid black plastic with a signature in white, most likely the company president and below the signatures also in white letters. October 14, 1964. The encasement is round and measures 48mm.

As I mentioned in an earlier issue I sometimes take part in the bid board at Waukegan Coin located on Lewis Avenue in Waukegan, IL. Recently, I bid and won an encased silver dollar that was a copy of a 1922 Peace dollar. The dollar is made from a casting and was done quite well. It appears at first glance to be an original but with closer inspection tiny indentations are visible. Also, the color of the Peace dollar is an unnatural gold silver which is also a give away that it is a copy. The piece, like the above original, is encased in black plastic but with no lettering on the obverse. The reverse is solid black plastic with white letters which reads, "A Buck For Luck." This item is also 48mm and is consigned by me in the club auction along with the above original and the following two.

Sometime ago a coin dealer friend sold me two other encased that were also copies made like the above. Rd, black plastic, no letters on obverse, reverse is solid black plastic with white letters which reads Honoring /Lewis S. Rosenstiel /May 12, 1958/Jacob M. Arvey/Barnet Hodes. This piece has a 1921 Morgan which also is a cast copy.

The other is a cast copy of a 1922 Peace dollar with red letters on white plastic. The obv.

reads, At Your Service Award. The rev. reads, Jewel/1959. Also, like the others it is round and measures 48mm.

I have never seen any cast copies until these three turned up. Evidently these commemorative and presentation pieces were less expensive to produce with the cast dollars. Common XF silver dollars in the late 50's and early 60's sold for \$1.50 to \$2.00 each. Cast copies were probably made for less then 50 cent each which included labor and materials so a considerable savings was realized when the give away was in any quantity.

I wonder how many other varieties exist out there. All three copies are similar so they most likely were made by the same company that obviously specialized in encased advertising. Does any ACE member have any information on any others and on the company that produced them? If so, let me know and I will share the info with ACE members.
