**AM 2 (411)12** - The American Tailors, 230 Grand Ave, Suits to Measure, 1911, rd, al, \*\*Milwaukee, WI, Al Zaika writes, "the Chicago, IL attribution should be dropped and Milw retained, Tom Casper sent me a photo copy of a 1913-1914 Wisconsin State Gazetteer, which list The American Tailors under Milwaukee and the 230 Grand Ave. address." Tom Casper writes, "In the Nov., 1998 issue of the Casement, page 29, it indicates that both Zaika and I have attributed the American Tailors piece differently. I have enclosed copies of my proof, pages from the 1913-14 Wisc. State Gazetteer. I have also sent

copies to Mr. Zaika. I don't know how two cities could have the same street address. But stranger things have happened."

**BA-11 (411)12** - Bazooka-Baloney. Al Zaika writes, "The Philadelphia attribution is not correct. The bubble gum was made by the Topps Chewing Gum Co., which was located in Brooklyn, N.Y. in 1957. The company moved to Duryea, Pa and is still in business at this location. The Fleer Corp. of Philadelphia was the maker of Double Bubble Gum, not Bazooka or Baloney. Reference - Thomas Register of American Manufacturers and Topps bubble gum package."

**BE-9 (470)13** - Bendix Automatic Washer... \*\*Cinn., Ohio, Reznick says the main office was in Ohio and not IN as was listed in issue 14.

He saw my purchase of the bread encasement and said Meads Bread Co. was in Austin. This was about 15 years ago."

I noticed in the February 1996 issue, (that is as far as I got so far) the mentioning of Fairbanks tokens of encased plugs, well, I have in my collection from Lang, Alaska two tokens (G.F.) 25c and 50c. These are what is called bingles. They are aluminum tokens encased in a brass collar by Edward C. Willis between 1917 and 1922. He also issued a one dollar bingle and an encased Indian head cent encased in aluminum. The first three list for \$45.00 each and the encased Indian at \$500.00. I am fortunate enough to have the first two only at the present time. The India encased was also called a "bingle" and was good for 25 cents at that time.

## Potpourri/ Information

### The American Museum of Atomic Energy

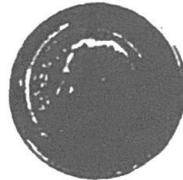
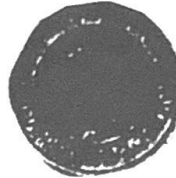
More on Tom Casper's issue  
13 article: I just recently  
purchased an encased Atomic  
Energy Commission United  
States of America dime at the  
Chicago Bank Note Show of all  
places. Yes, two dealers out of  
about 150 did have encased coins  
along with their paper money.  
The encasement has a 1943  
Mercury Dime, with white  
letters and the wavy lines  
around the dime. It has a blue  
plastic holder with a see through  
hole for the obv of the dime.



The reverse is solid and reads in white letters: Atomic Energy Commission United States of America. The obv. reads: N.Y. World's Fair 1964 1965 Neutron Irradiated Dime. It measures 48mm. I called the American Museum of Science and Energy, 1-423-576-3200 and yes they are still in existence but no longer make their well-known and collectible encased. The lady I talked to said they discontinued when the clad coinage came out. Also, the lady at the museum could not tell me how the encased were made. Nor is the machine that made them in existence. And, unfortunately there are no encased dime hoards anywhere at the Museum. Too bad for us ACES. Evidently the visitor supplied the dime and the encasement was made right then and there. Anyway that was the impression the employee related to me.

## Interesting Information from Jim Lawniczak

I have come across interesting information about encased for the Casement.

1. I was on the internet and became curious about the American Museum of Atomic Energy pieces. Those are the 28mm pieces with the dimes inserted showing on the front only, with the plastic cover. They say: "American Museum of Atomic Energy/Neutron Irradiated." This is a very common piece -- they must have given out thousands. The dates I have seen range from circulated Mercuries (20s, 30s and 40s) and Roosevelt up to 1964. The museum was founded in 1949 in Oak Ridge Tennessee (this

verifies the pieces to Oak Ridge). In July 1978, it changed its name to the American Museum of Science and Energy and is still in operation today in Oak Ridge under that name.

2. I recently bought a very interesting 1901 Indian clover encased. The cent is **certainly** the original cent as it **has many** of the marks on it that **match** the clover on this piece (stem and even clover veins). I think I have mentioned before that I have never seen an original clover encased where there was not some marking on the cent to match the clover. However, I noticed that there seemed to be more room at about 8:00 on the piece than usual (although no light shows through). On further checking, I noticed that the cent was not tightly in the encasement (it could move), and because this was an inexpensive piece and in the interest of science, I decided to see if I could push it out (don't try this with an expensive piece, you may be disappointed with the results). It did push out. I was able to fit it back in again though as before, flush with the encasement and so that no light shows through. Only one of two things is possible -- either the original cent was never tightly struck into the encasement in 1901 (which is what I believe); or someone punched out the cent and then was able to put the same cent back into the encasement. There are no tooling marks on the encasement near the cent. I believe that the Indian cents were not as firmly struck into their encasements as later cents were.

3. I have continued to follow encased cent sales on the Internet, particularly E-bay and

unconscionable as the E-bay stock price seems to be. The Internet buyers seem to love the cardboard, Put a Penny encased. These are the encased where the penny is easily removed and substituted. I saw one set of Indian cents in the cardboard go for an amazing price (these came out in the 40s, so it is clear that someone simply put Indian cents in these to make them more interesting). Recently, two put-a-pennies with 1943 cents in them sold for \$20.50, an amazing price. A Davidson's 1953 encased from Ambridge, Pennsylvania, one of the most common encased pieces and surely worth no more than \$2-\$3 sold for \$10.60. A 1950 Rexall encased, another very common encased with various dates in the early 50s sold for an astounding \$14.50.

4. Most of you have probably seen the Charlotte, North Carolina Medic Million Dollar Payoff pieces. They are very common. One internet seller stated that he had received his piece from someone who told him that he got it from a can of Motor Medic oil additive in the 60s.

5. Some things to report : The Ohio catalog now has 650 listings, thanks to all the help I have been receiving. I have submitted a two part article to TAMS on encased -- the first part is about the encased of the 1901 Buffalo Pan American Exposition. It will be coming out soon.

6. I have enclosed a picture from E-Bay on another Alaska piece -- a 1953D. I also enclosed a picture of one of the 1957 Topps baseball cards -- which the recipient could turn into a lucky

penny. Have you ever seen the 1957 lucky penny described?

## Fankhauser Fun by Bryan Ryker

**Fankhauser Fun** is a regular column featuring stories and new information about Fankhauser encased coins. I'm always looking for interesting bits of information about Fankhauser pieces. Sometimes just a little

story or memory about a place or a person brings a piece of life. Every one of Earl's pieces has a story if we just knew them.

A while back I was searching for whatever information I could find on encased coins on the internet and came across a Usenet posting about encased coins with repunched mint marks (RPMs). I wrote the fellow and found out that two of the pieces he had were Fankhauser encased!

Since then I've run across encased collectors who specialize in RPMs, and I've learned of one other Fankhauser piece with an RPM. Below are the three Fankhauser RPM pieces I know of, plus I've listed the fourth piece that the first fellow told me of.

(IN)-(FWA)-HO-40 HOLLYWOOD PACKAGE STORE // J. JOYNERR/1333 S. LAFAYETTE This piece has been found with a 1953 D/D double mint mark cent in it.

(IN)-(FWA)-IR-10 IRMA'S LUNCH // 712 BARR/ FORT WAYNE This piece has been found with a 1956 D/D double mint mark cent in it.

And the non-Fankhauser piece was: ITS NAME / INDICATES ITS CHARACTER // THE LINCOLN NATIONAL / LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

This piece has been found with a 1956 D/D double mint mark cent in it.

Has anyone discovered any other Fankhauser RPM pieces?

Milwaukee by Phil  
Bressett**

At the Milwaukee Coin show back in Sept, 1998 I shared a table with my good friend and fellow ACE member and editor of The Casement Jerry Binsfeld. I sell rare coin books, bank notes, rare coins and exnumia. Jerry is a vest pocket dealer who specializes in bullion and exnumia. At shows Jerry and I share tables when our calendars match up. We generally will advertise that we are buying what we sell via a small sign taped to the bourse light. Generally not too much opportunity arises that I even get a chance to make an offer for exnumia. The Milwaukee show seemed to be no different until a retired pharmacist stopped by and stated he collects anything related to drug stores and pharmacology. He of course inquired about the topic and wanted to know if I had anything that fit his interests. He then stated he had purchased a small antique jar full of encased coins at an antique mall in Ohio. He related he searched through the lot of 117 pieces and found four different drug stores pieces. All 117 were Fankhauser encased, rd, 32mm and were loose in the jar. (According to Bryan Ryker's book there are 18 different Fankhauser pieces related to drug stores) I ended up buying the 113 pieces and found there were 31 different in the lot. I paid \$1.00 each, knowing there were a lot of duplicates but not knowing any of the subject areas. The seller stated he paid \$90. for the lot. 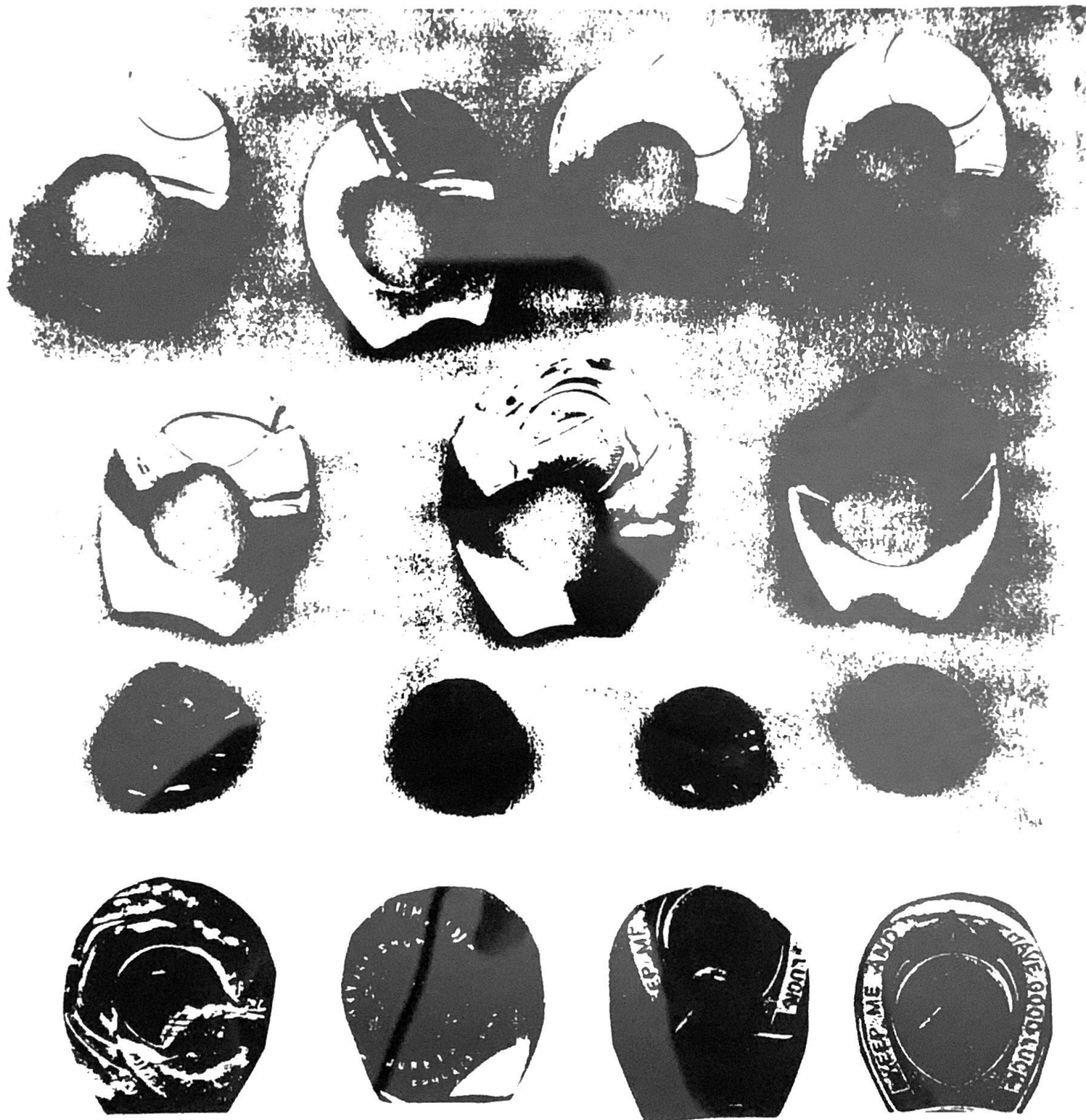
