Editor's Message

First of all I wish to thank the members who sent information to be included in Issue 16. Al Weinberg, CA., did a neat article on replaced coins in encasements. Jim Lawniczak, OH, sent in a very interesting piece of literature on the marketing and sale of encased coins from years past. Jim also added and cleared up some variety questions on the Washington, D.C. souvenirs pieces as well as some other observations that he wishes to share with the ACE membership. Dave Hunsicker, WI, sent an interesting post card that was used to get recruits to sell a magazine and the one who submitted names of potential sellers was rewarded with a lucky penny.

The reason issue 16 is late (May deadline) is due to the encased project. The order was placed in March and here it is early June and still not complete. I received a call from High Tech graphics sales representative recently and the final drawing was not up to standards. A new lettering idea was requested from the die sinker and this then resulted in the delay. If the encased order should arrive before June 11, ordering instructions and exact cost will

be included in this issue if not plan on an August ordering period. The necessary ordering information will then be included in Issue 17. Also, the 1995 Canadian cents may not work because of its slight octagon shape. If that being the case 1998 or 1999 Lincoln cents will be used (depending availability). If you remember the project called for the encasing of 200 1962 Panama cents, 200 1995 Canadian cents and 600 1995 U.S. cents. The 1995 date was selected because that is the year that ACE was organized. A Panama cent was selected because of the novelty aspect. The Panama cent was produced by the U.S. mint in the sixties so they match the U.S. cent in size and because of the Earl Fankhauser connection. Earl used the Panama cent in two of his encased. One was a 1961 date used in CA-LME-RO-10-H (The Roses-LaMesa, Calif.) and the other was a 1963 Panamanian cent used in IN-OTI-BO-10-B (Bobco/Foreign Coins, Otis, Indiana).

Issue 16 also has the known encased from the great states of Calif., Maine, and Nebraska. Montana will appear in Issue 17. ACE wishes to thank the following State Catalogers for a job well done - Duane Feisel,

CA; Dave Smith, MA, and Steve Drake, NE. Once again additions, corrections and pertinent information on any encased from these states should be sent to the above ACES. A check list for Calif. and Nebraska are used for space considerations, both Steve and Duane have another list which is complete with slogans, etc.

The A.N.A. will be in Chicago from Aug. 11-15. We will try to have an ACE meeting sometime during the convention. So far no details. Hopefully we can set a date and a time and if you are there and want to take in an informal meeting drop on by. Check the literature or look for a poster. The ANA is always a great convention. Plenty of dealers, plenty of exhibits, plenty of educational programs and most likely some neat encased will be for sale.

Also an informal ACE meeting will be held in Omaha-99 on Saturday, Sept.4 at 1:00 p.m. Here again take in a great collectible show, say hello to all your collecting friends and if time permits come to the ACE meeting. The meeting is informal and should last about 30 minutes at the max.

ACE appreciates the contributors and the maverick ID 'ers. Keep up the good work.

Also all the update lists and rubbings of new additions is also appreciated.

Remember too, if you want to see anything else and have some ideas for The Casement let us know. Lake. It is located about 8 mi. south of Meadville, PA on Rt. 19. It is approx. 18 miles east of Ohio State Line, (omit-Near Conneaut, Ohio in NE corner of Ohio) In fact its 45 miles from my home, I go there a couple of times each year.

Jim L. information, The Cass Scenic Railroad is located at Cass west Virginia. It is a State Park and the concept is to preserve a Logging Railroad from the early part of this century.

At Cass you will see Logging Locomotives. These Locomotives are geared steam locomotives. The folks at Cass have restored them to excellent condition. There were three kinds of locomotives.

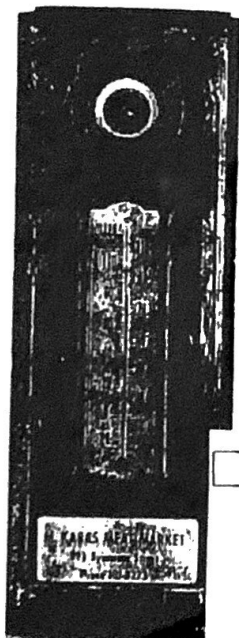
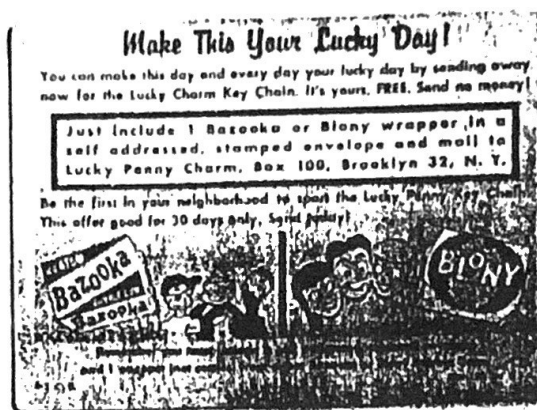
Congratulations on another great Casement. You have managed to set just the right tone for the Casement -- it's like a club meeting in print. None of the other token clubs can match this style. Good job!

I have come across a few interesting items in the last several months:

1. After I sent you the front of the 1957 Topps baseball card, which allowed the lucky recipient to obtain a free lucky penny, I obtained a copy of the back of the card. It is enclosed. The piece that the Topps card holder won is the same 1957 Bazooka/Blony [not Baloney] piece, discussed in the March 1999 Casement as Maverick No. 411. This verifies Al Zaika's attribution of the maverick to Brooklyn N.Y., as the address to send for the free Bazooka/Blony piece is a P.O. Box in Brooklyn. I don't have the 1957 Topps card -- I think it is a very expensive item (\$100 or more) and will get more expensive if encased collectors, in addition to baseball card collectors, join the hunt. It is probably scarce due to the fact that most of the cards were sent in for free encased rather than saved.

2. I obtained a 1930s advertising brochure from the Leyse Aluminum Company of Kewaunee, Wisconsin for "Lucky Money." The enclosed copy is very interesting -- it shows samples of the Leyse Aluminum work. Note the pieces where the writing is on a curved, rather than straight, line. That style was fairly common in the 20s and 30s -- I believe that those pieces were all manufactured by Leyse. Also, the horseshoe pieces with the "S" style (like the Youngstown Ohio, Ohio Savings & Loan Co. piece) are all Leyse. I also enclose a 1930 sales pitch letter from Leyse. The interesting comment in the letter is that one of the salesman "has one account that has bought over 250,000 Lucky Coins No. 4 within the last two years." What encased piece from 1928-1930 do you think exists in such quantities that over a quarter million pieces were made? I can't think of any -- the Stork Club would come to mind, but those pieces were later.

3. I have come across an interesting encased, thermometer advertising piece and have acquired two of them. The pieces were made in Iowa in the late 40s. It is a mirror, 3 1/2 x 10 inches. At the top is the encased cent (either 1948s or 1949s in the pieces I have seen), set inside the mirror, with a

horseshoe drawn around the cent on the mirror, saying, "Keep Me - I Bring You Good Luck." The thermometer is set into the middle of the piece. Then at the bottom is the advertising. I have a piece for "Werner Motors/ DeSoto - Plymouth/ Hastings" which I was told was Hastings Michigan and a piece for "C & D Implement Store/ Anamosa, Iowa/ Phone 600." Printed on the back of my Hastings piece is "Vernon Co/ Newton, Iowa," apparently the manufacturer. Here is a picture of a M. Karas Meat Market piece that I didn't buy. An interesting set, cost around \$20-\$30.

4. As I mentioned to you on E-mail, the Ohio catalog is now over 710 pieces. Based on what I have seen of sales of Ohio and reports by all my helpers on their Ohio collections, compared to the listings I already have, I believe the final Ohio count (assuming that I can actually find all Ohio) would be over 1500. I am absolutely certain that there are over 1000 different Ohio pieces. Based on my experience with encased, I believe that New York and Pennsylvania certainly and Illinois probably will have more encased than Ohio. I don't think any other state will. My best guess is that New York will be the encased champion.

5. I too (like Steve Drake) have now finished the all 50 state encased collection. I obtained a Wyoming Chevy piece in January (1948, Tyrrell Chevrolet Co./ Cheyenne, Wyo.), to complete my set. In my experience, the toughest states are Wyoming, Utah, Mississippi and Delaware. Hawaii would certainly be on the list but for the Fankhauser Hawaii. Some other states with a reputation as being tough are more common than generally thought -- Maine (in particular), New Hampshire, Alabama, Alaska and New Mexico. In the same sale in which I bought the Wyoming piece, a 1946 Delaware round piece: "Delmarva Park/ Harrington, Del./ Lunches/ Beer Dinners," was at almost \$50 at one time during the sale. I don't know if it sold for even more.

Thanks for your letter and information about the Pan-American Buffalo encased. Some of the information on that one sheet of paper you sent me was very useful -- not only on the Pan American encased but also for the catalogs (there were several NY, MI and OH pieces listed). Do you have any more old catalogs available? Or even just the rest of this catalog?

I have gone over my Washington DC bell pieces -- there were so many. There are seven distinct bell shaped dies in my collection and I will describe them to you and send you xeroxes:

Type 1 has a small hole at the top and the following: Souvenir/ of [squiggly design on both sides of the of]// [squiggly design on both sides]/ WASHINGTON, D.C.\\ Keep Me and/ [small squiggly design on both sides]/ Never Go Broke// [large ornate design on both sides connected by thin line under cent]/ I Bring Good Luck. I have a 1906 and a 1909 Indian which match this type in my collection.

Type 2 has the same obverse (to the best I can tell) as type 1. The reverse is different in that the top design consists of three lines coming out of one point (the point is towards the center) instead of the squiggly lines and the ornate design is different in quite a few ways (the lattice like work on type 1 is tighter, the top of the design on type 1 ends in a curl, while it ends in a straight line on type 2. The two sides of the ornate design are not connected on type 2. The only example of type 2 in my collection is a 1909 Lincoln cent.

Type 3 has a larger hole at the top than type 1 and 2 have. Other than the larger hole, it looks like the same obv. die as types 1 and 2. The reverse is again different. The word "Me" is smaller than the other words, has a line both above and below it and slants upward. Type 3 has the three-line design of type 2 but a bit different -- the design is a little larger on type 3. The ornate design is different than either type 1 or type 2, for example, the top line is shorter than it is on type 2. Type 3s in my collection contain 1930, 1935 and 1939 cents.

Type 4 is completely different than types 1-3. There is a hole at the top, which appears to be just slightly larger than the hole on type 3. The obverse: Souvenir/ of/ [two squiggly designs]// [two squiggly designs]/ Washington, D.C./ [three lobed leaf like design in each bottom corner]\\ I Bring/ Good Luck// [small star on each side of the cent, beaded around cent]/ Keep Me And/ Never Go Broke. Type 4s in my collection include a 1947D (could this have been a circulated cent?), 1959D and 1960D large.

Type 5 is similar to type 4. The differences are -- type 5 is beaded around the cent on both sides, the design at the bottom corner of the obverse is different -- longer and thinner; it looks more like a twig; and there is a signature at the bottom of the obverse -- A Capsco [three small spikes] Product. The reverse of 4 and 5 are either the same or extremely close -- I imagine that I notice a difference in the direction the "D" of Good points but I may just be imagining it. My type 5s are 1953D and 1954D.

Type 6 is identical to type 5, without the Capsco signature. My only type 6 is a 1958D.

Type 7 is much different than types 4-6. It is holed at the top and has the simplest obverse of all the types -- only words -- no design whatsoever. Souvenir of/ Washington, D.C. The reverse looks the same as the type 4-6 reverses. The only example of this (just bought it at a show about 2 weeks ago) is a 1959D.

I think that you may be right -- because the other clover Pan Am pieces are indeed different dies, perhaps I ought to catalog them differently. One problem in doing so is that on worn pieces and on some pieces with weak strikes, the letters can be hard to read. For example, I do not believe that there is a piece with "Pat. Appld. 1901" as in Var. III of the catalog you sent me. That area is always hard to read and I think the cataloger misread "Pat. Appld For" as "Pat. Appld. 1901." Also, I do not think there is a thin stem and a blunt stem. I believe that the stem simply can be blunt because of wear or based on strike. Based on the pieces I have, the new catalog numbers will be: (and I assume there will be more):

NY-BUF-PX-10. The stem left variety, with "Pat. Appld. for." on the reverse. The stem points just to the left of the top of the "E." I think that this is a relatively uncommon piece but am not yet certain.

NY-BUF-PX-11. Obverse as -PX-10, but with Pat. Apr. 23, 1901

on the reverse.

NY-BUF-PX-12. Obverse has a long stem, extending past the E, pointing between the E and the N. Reverse, Pat. Appld. for. I believe that this is the most common of the Pan American clover varieties.

NY-BUF-PX-13. Same as -PX-12, except for the reverse, Pat. Apr. 23, 1901.

NY-BUF-PX-18. The stem to the right obverse. The stem points to the P in Exposition. Reverse: Pat. Appld. for. This is the only type of the stem right type that I know of. I have one where the reverse is rotated 180 degrees, but that cannot be a separate type.

From what I hear and from the catalog you supplied me, there may be other varieties of the stem left, but I have not seen them and they are unverified to me.

I have never been all that interested in Mavericks but I may have to go through my Mavericks someday and send you a list. I came across one interesting one that I would like you to list in the Casement -- there is a possibility that it might be a Chevrolet piece, issued at the time of the 1947-48 Chevy series. I have two pieces, one with a 1946 cent, another with a 1947 cent, but the encasements are identical: Round, 35mm, "C.A." is the Key// Win Prizes\\ KMANGB. These pieces with 1946 and 1947 dates came out just before the "S.A." Chevy series. Perhaps this piece went to the salesman -- "C.A." may have stood for "Customer Always," and the salesmen could win prizes. I do have a large (app. 50mm) Chevrolet button pin, which the salesmen probably were supposed to wear, which says, "Ask Me About/ [Chevrolet inside Chevrolet logo/ "S.A." [in large letters].

I do have one answer for you on the Casement mavericks: the Cass Scenic Railroad piece is from Cass, West Virginia. I enclose a printout from their Internet site.

I think you are cataloging the Connecticut encased. In response to my recent TAMS article I received a question from a Connecticut attorney, who enclosed a free sample of the encased he had made in 1996. It is the only attorney encased that I know of. It is a 1996D, horseshoe, holed at bottom: Atty. Lester E. Blank/ Bridgeport, CT// (203) 336-1818\\ KMAHGL/ IBGL.

I saw a "Victory" reverse encased on e-bay, which has a different reverse than I have ever seen. Instead of the Victory// World Peace words, this one says: "Victory// Year" Also the V-E and V-J dates do not appear to be in scrolls, as is customary. I enclose a picture.

I also came across a Bazooka, Blony encased on e-Bay. Here is a picture.

I have no problem with your reprinting my TAMS article. I have e-mailed Dave to ask what he thinks about it (it was his pictures that went along with the article). You reprinted the Kohlman article -- so I assume you have talked with him in the past and got his permission on that.

Finally, an Oklahoma piece sold for over \$100. I can't imagine why. The 1933D is not that rare (I have 7 in my collection) and I cannot see why the city, state or merchant would generate \$100 excitement. Perhaps this is another example of Internet excess.

Hope all is well.

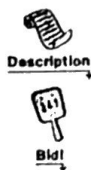

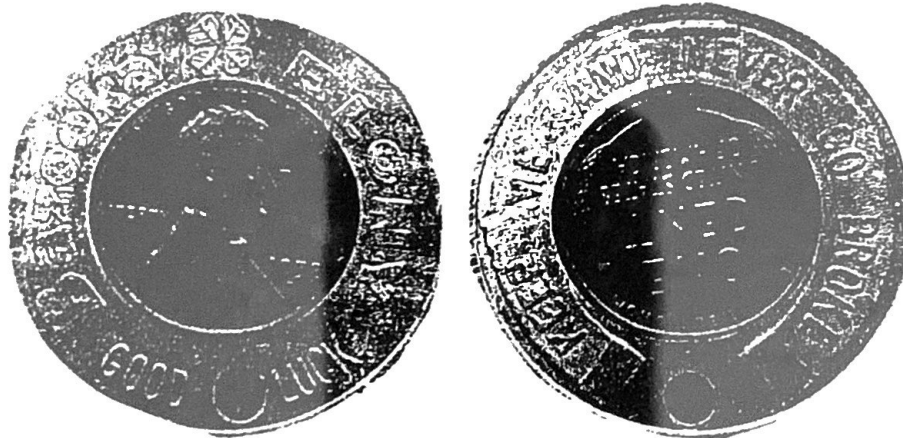
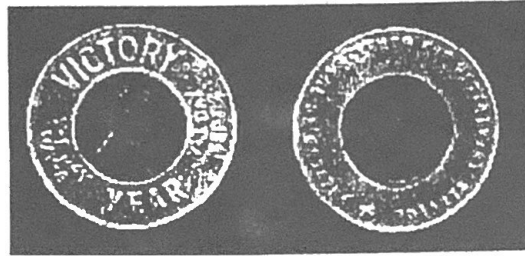

Things are coming along well on cataloging the California encased coins. One thing I have learned is that there is a lot of different types of encasements! Enclosed are photographs of the obverse and reverse of a piece from San Francisco. This is a fairly modern piece with a 1996D cent, so I suspect that there are probably other similar pieces in souvenir shops around the country that cater to tourists. ACE members might want to check potential places in their area. Maybe even airport gift shops would carry them. The encasement is clear plastic outside covering a black plastic insert. The overall size (different from the photos) is 80mm long and 32mm high. Sure is different!

The next pair of photographs is for another unusual piece - the first encasement of this type I have ever seen. The obverse is cream colored cardboard with red printing. The back is metal (I call it tin since I did not have a magnet to check if it was ferrous), and the four tabs are folded over the cardboard obverse to hold everything together. Only the reverse of the cent shows, so I do not know the date. All the reverse letter and design is incuse, and the cent is contained within a raised flange. Here is how I have recorded this listing for our catalog:

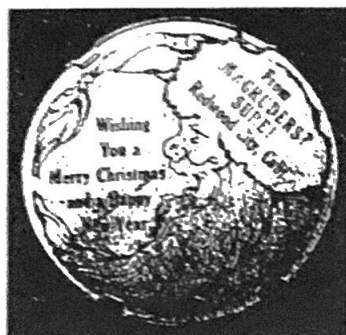
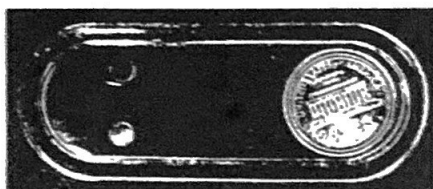
It sure is a neat piece, and I am trying to obtain it for my collection.

Looking forward to getting some listing for the CA encased catalog and, hopefully, some pieces for my own collection of CA encased.

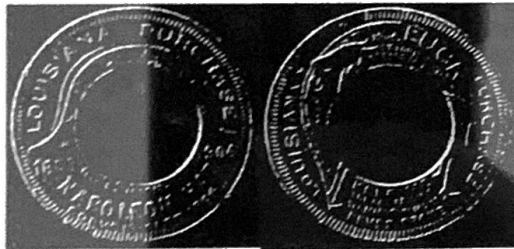
REPLACEMENT OF ENCASED COINS

by Alan Weinberg (CM294)

Among serious collectors of old encased coins, there is a significant concern that the encased coin be "original," that is, not replaced. Another way of stating this is that there is concern that the encased coin be that from when the encasement was manufactured, and not a replacement for that original coin which had been removed after manufacture for one reason or another.

A replaced coin can reduce the value of an encasement from 25% to 90%, depending on the rarity and desirability of the encasement. For instance, a Utah saloon chamberpot good-for encasement (yes, there is one extant, not even listed in Bob Campbell's new Utah opus) is known to have a replaced extremely fine Indian Head cent. In my opinion, honed by 45+ years in this hobby, **its value would be reduced by perhaps 25% from what it would be worth if the cent were "original"**

But the common 1901 Pan American Expo encased, in say EF, would be worth only \$2 to \$3 with a replaced

cent, down from approximately \$20 with an original cent. Why such a reduction? Simply because a Pan Am encasement is so easily acquired with an original cent intact.

Many would ask the reasonable question, "How can I tell if the coin is original?" There are several tests one can perform for the basis of a judgment.

First, one must understand how an encased coin is minted. A "new" cent - usually uncirculated - is placed into the round cut-out, slightly larger than the

coin, in an aluminum blank. Then the dies strike the legend and design onto the aluminum. Sometimes, depending on alignment of the striking dies and the blank/coin planchet, some of us have seen part of the legend or design overlapping onto the cent.

The pressure from the striking dies causes the aluminum to "close in on" and crimp the rims of the cent. This pressure also flattens the rim of the cent so that the plane of the cent is the same as the plane of the aluminum frame and its legend.

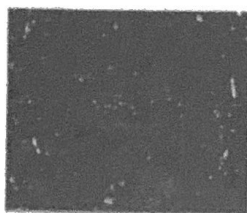
At times this die pressure is so great that the cent "buckles," or warps, resulting in an undulating surface. This, in my opinion, does *not* reduce an encasement's value - indeed, it is convincing evidence that the cent is original.

An additional effect from the extreme die pressure that is occasionally seen is that the aluminum so overlaps the cent that it no longer looks round.

So, the following tests *usually* are foolproof in determining whether or not a cent is original.

- a. Does the encased cent exhibit the same degree of wear and circulation abuse as the aluminum frame? It should - except on those occasions where an old cent is encased as a *souvenir* in a much later encasement as is the case of the old Indian Head cent encased issued for a 1939 "Union Pacific" movie premier in Omaha.
- b. Are the rims of the encased cent flat and on the same plane as the aluminum surrounding the coin's rim? They usually will be - except with the odd-shaped aluminum encasements such as hearts. I've never seen a heart-shaped encasement (there are approximately six to eight different heart-shaped encasements known, all rare) with a cent's rim flat and even with the aluminum. This is because the cent is always at the bottom, narrow portion of the heart and there is insufficient aluminum metal "flow" to cover the rim of the cent. Consequently, on all heart-shaped encaseds I've seen (probably

eight to ten specimens, the cent looks like it is ready to pop out of the encasement and does not sit flat and level in the heart shaped aluminum frame.

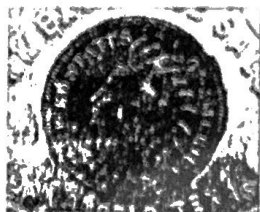


"Slice" of light showing around a cent replaced in a frame

Is there a slice of light around the cent's periphery when it is held up between your fingertips to back lighting? I've never seen light peeking through the periphery when an original cent meets the aluminum. The die pressure on the aluminum frame causes it to close in tight around the cent. Imagine your fist coming down on a piece of clay, and how that would "squish" the clay around anything that might have been placed on it.



A thin flange of aluminum completely around the periphery of the coin

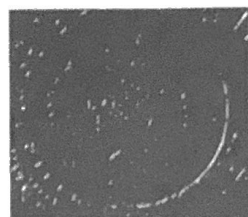


"Fingers" of aluminum from the frame overlapping the encased cent

- d. Often there are thin, toy aluminum flanges overlapping the extreme periphery of the cent caused by the mounting pressure. Use a five-power magnifying glass to see this effect. This is a strong indication that the coin is original.

- e. Apply moderate, even strong, pressure on the encased coin with your thumb from both sides of the coin while holding the encasement in your fingers. Does the coin dislodge? It definitely should not if the coin is original. It's in there tight if original. If the coin is F-I or better, use a cloth or tissue between your finger and the coin. Etiquette and common sense dictates you don't put a fingerprint on a nice coin.

These are five pretty solid tests, but they are not absolutely foolproof guarantees. But I can tell you this: if you find a replaced cent encasement that passes all five of these tests, I'd sure like to see it. I've never seen one in my years of experience.

One more observation. These tests all apply to cents encased in aluminum frames. Not all tests apply to nickel or silver coins in non-aluminum metal frame encasements due to the hardness of these coins and the metal of the encasement frame.

And in some encasements, notably the Calvert Distillers and Buck silver dollars, the coins were manually inserted *after* the encasement frames were struck by dies.

Now, there are collectible encasements in which the frame is made of a flexible, or even rigid, plastic. Of course, the comments made here do not apply to those situations, nor to mirror encasements. ■
