Editor's Message

Welcome to the Fall issue #21 of The Casement. The big Omaha Labor Day week end show was a success. A good number of ACES were at the show. We held an informal meeting on Sat. of the show at 1:00 p.m. See Steve Drakes notes on the meeting later in this issue. I would like two comment on two areas of business, though. The first being that of a value system like NATCA will be implemented in the upcoming catalogs. Many coin and exonumia dealers have expressed their feelings and nearly all stated that a catalog without some type of value listing will not meet the needs of the hobby. Just about everyone wants some idea of value. We all realize that putting prices in a new catalog like the upcoming encased books is difficult but state catalogers probably will have some kind of idea on value. We will need ACES to give their insights as to value especially after the first draft. The second is the issue of raising the dues. It cost about \$2.20 each for most issues to print and mail. So \$7.00 is not enough. At the meeting we voted to raise the dues up to a ceiling of \$15.00 a year but for now we will raise the dues from

\$7.00 a year to \$10.00 a year. The reason is that we have four sources that can help add income, sale of pass issues of The Casement, auction donations and auction consignment fees, sale of club encased and potential profit from the Club's encased books. If after this we still can't meet cost then dues will go up again at a later date. If this should happen members will be notified and a date will be given as to the time of an increase.

Also, to keep cost down each issue will be limited to a certain number of pages so that we can send each issue for 77 cents or the rate that this will be with the new increase. This also will keep printing cost down where we can make it on \$2.50 or less an issue. When listing a state with a large listing we may have to use two issues.

Duane's auction was a good one. Several rare "good fors" went for top dollar. All of the encased were in the mail bid portion of the NATCA sale. All went for decent bids. A prices realized will be listed later in this issue or for sure in the Winter Issue.

Two state catalogers, Nevada and Texas, were inadvertently left off the list in issue 20. They are back on.

Jim Lawniczak again has some nice information to pass along to members on the field of encasements. He also sent us a very extensive list of Michigan encased. Jim did a wonderful detailed piece of work. His masterpiece is 48 pages and he is not done. He sent a complimentary copy of this his first draft to all his contributors asking for corrections and additions. He has 305 cataloged and states that there are plenty more to be cataloged. It 1998 Jim had 460 Ohio entries and now it is up to 850. Gerald McLellan sent ACE a great list of Mass. encased that he has in his collection. Gerald has a very extensive collection but states that he knows of 30 that he doesn't have. Vic Nolan sent us a fantastic catalog of Pennsylvania encased that he, Rich Gaetano and Herman Agua put together. There are 119 pages and is truly another masterpiece. Dan Agler sent a wonderful Texas list that appears to be very extensive and well organized as well. Dan has a great start for a project that he has just started in recent months. My Wisconsin catalog that I am working on looks rather anemic compared to the recent ones that were sent to ACE.

Once again when renewing, always write your ACE number and expiration number on your check. These numbers are located behind your name on the mailing label. Also, kindly list your contributions on separate pieces of paper. A letter to members on one, classified on another, bids on another, etc.

Sorry, this issue is two months late. I can only say sorry and my excuse is my job. (2 nights a week and 6 to 6 each day - there are trying to kill me, this my last year before retirement. Don't they know that ACE is more fun and almost more important!)

AL-1(86)4 -Alliance Zone Cab, Ph 5222, 1850-1950, 1950-d cent, **Alliance, Ohio, Lawniczak, Jim writes, "You can put the second star on mayerick (86), the Alliance Zone Cab piece. I did call the Alliance Ohio library and they checked the 1950 Alliance directory for me. The librarian did not believe that there were 4 digit phone numbers in the 50s and was surprised to find that indeed Zone Cab was listed in the directory with the phone number that is on this piece -- 5222."

ES-1(148)5 - Esskay/Quality /Meat Products/Taste The Difference Q-Wal-ity Makes//kmaywhgl, 1964, hs. ** Baltimore, MD, Hajek, Millard writes, "I am the ACE cataloger who listed the Esskay encased MD-EC-28 attributed to Baltimore, MD. Esskay has been in business in Baltimore as far as 1922 with a listing for that year's Baltimore City Directory. A couple years ago the business was sold to Smithfield of Virginia and the meat packing plant in Baltimore was closed. However, Esskay products and particularly hot dogs are sold at Oriole Park in Camden Yards, the home of the Baltimore Orioles. The Esskay packages still carry a Baltimore, MS address. Unfortunately I have no

knowledge or information about the Portland, Oregon listing. Hope this helps to answer your question and confusion about the encased I listed for Baltimore."

Clark Curtis Parker/4825 Ross\\kmangb lbgl, 1948 hs, ham - **Dallas, TX, Cross, Terry writes, "This is from Dallas, but I can't say when it was issued. 1948 City Directory shows Clark and Parker Autos at a different address (Maple Springs), but shows John M. Calrk and Curtis Parker to be in the auto selling business together. However, the Fred Johnson Auto Co. is the occupant of 4825 Ross, together with Shav's Garage. In the 1950 City Directory, Clark and Parker Autos was on Marquette Street. A different auto sales business was at 4825 Ross. In 1952, Clark and Parker Autos was at still a different address, but not at 4825 Ross."

MO-6(379)11 - David Moore/ 124 th/ District Judge, **Longview, TX, Cross, Terry writes, "David Moore presided in the 124th District Court)TX state dist. court) in Longview, TX. I have found reported appellate decisions of cases that were tried in his court in 1972, 1973 and 1974."

DO-5(482)13 - Doubleday Book Shops, books, records\\Good Luck (luck symbols) 1946, rd, al, (grooves as a record under lettering) comment from Jim Lawnizak, Jim writes, "Doubleday Books, records piece, no. (482) -- first, I have never seen this piece with the word shops on it and I don't think that is correct -- if anyone has a piece with shops on it, please send a copy of it to me as it would be a separate piece for cataloging in the NY catalog. Second, I thank Al Zaika for persistence - I concur with the change in attribution of this piece from Long Island City, New York City to Garden City. I forgot that I actually have here at home a Doubleday book from the early 1950s -- they were Isaac Asimov's first publisher and he was one of my favorite authors. It is the Foundation trilogy. Anyway, I opened to the title page and voila, "Doubleday & Company, Inc. Garden City N.Y." It wasn't until the late 80s that Doubleday, following a corporate merger, began listing New York City on its books. Garden City is not in NYC, it is a close in suburb out on Long Island in Nassau County about 5 miles from the Queens border. I called Doubleday in Garden City and was told that the corporate offices of Doubleday have always been out in Garden City and the editorial offices have always been in Manhattan."

PA-8(759)19 - Parkyakarkus Lucky Penny, 1938, **Beverly Hills, Hollywood, CA, additional information - Lawniczak/ Zaika, Jim L. writes, "Parkyakarkus was Harry Einstein, a radio comedian and actor, the father of Albert Einstein. No, not the scientist,

the actor who has taken the stage name Albert Brooks. According to the World Almanac, Albert Einstein Brooks was born in 1947 in Beverly Hills, CA. But where was Parkyakarkus when this piece came out in 1938? Many of the early radio shows originated from New York City, so I did some checking on the internet(there are plenty of articles there about Albert Brooks, including his Playboy interview) to see if this piece should be in the N.Y. catalog.

Both Parkyakarkus and Brook's mother, Thelma Berstein, with stage name of Thelma Leeds, were in a number of Hollywood pictures in the 1930s, beginning in 1936, before this piece came out. According to the introduction to Albert Brook's Playboy interview, his parents "met as contract players at RKO in the Thirties!" RKO is a Hollywood studio, now located in Los Angeles. So I would think this piece should be property attributed to Berverly Hills, Hollywood or Los Angeles, pick one. If I had to choose, I'd pick Beverly Hills, where Albert Einstein was born."

Al Zaika writes, "Parkyakarkus. This was the name created by comedian Harry Einstein, based on some Greek men that hung out at his fathers antique shop. Harry made his radio debut around 1930 on radio station KNAC, in Boston, Ma. He was soon discovered by Eddie Cantor and became a regular member of Cantor's weekly radio show. He later made movies for RKO Studios and worked with many of the famous Hollywood stars. In 1941, he had his own weekly show, "Meet Me at Parky's", which ran for about 10

years. He died in 1958. In my opinion, Hollywood, Ca. should be the attribution for his encased cent."

PE-10(763)19 - A.D. Pelunis/De Soto, Plymouth, 1950d. **Lakewood, Ohio(Cleveland area), Lawniczak/Reznick, Jim L. writes, "I don't think this piece is a complete maverick. I have four references to 1950, 1950D and 1952D Pelunis pieces from "Lakewood." Also, I have seen a 1953D piece pictured on eBay, which says: "A.G. Pelunis/BO. 2-6433//Lakewood/DeSoto[hole] Plymouth. So the Cleveland area town that the piece is from is a westside town, Lakewood." Joe R, says, "I have a 1950 piece that states Lakewood, Ohio."

PO-3(767) 19 - Pomeroy's World's Fair of Gifts, Lucky Token/Save This Token/It May Be Worth Many Dollars to You At Pomeroy's, 1937. *PA, Zaika/ Aqua, Dr. Herman writes, "There was a chain of Pomeroy's-many stores throughout the East - I know about 4 PA stores -Wilkes-Barre, Reading, Pottsville and Harrisburg. The encased probably came from one of the above cities; which one - I don't know about. There are a few tokens issued by Pomeroy and some have specific locations." Al Z. writes, "Several of my business directories show that Pomeroy,s main store was in Harrisburg, Pa. and the Reading, Pa. store was a branch. I could not find any other locations for this store."

RO-15(777)19 - Mirror with encased 1935 cent, Rose(cursive) Dress Shops/14495/This mirror Good for 50 cents/On any Purchase of \$6.99 or more/ At 6402 So. Halsted St\\mirror, **Chicago, Il, Reznick, Joe says,

"Leo Rose had many stores on the southside and downtown area of Chicago."

BE-20(793)20 - Bentley's Jewelers/Clothiers/If Lost/ Return/125 E. 12th St., 1946 *Chicago, Il, Reznick, Joe says, possibly Chicago, 12th St. was renamed Roosevelt after FDR died."

EM-2(796)20 - Empire Motor/401 N. Brand/Willys, Overland, **Phila, PA., Nolan/Reznick, Vic Nolan writes, "Empire Motor is from Phila., PA, street should be 401 N. Broad St. not 401 N. Brand as listed, possible error encased if listed as Brand." Joe R. says, "Phil. based on prior research."

FA-12(797)20 - Fairfax Paint Co./703 N. Fairfax Ave WH 6675 WH 5615, 1947, *Los Angeles, CA, Reznick, Joe says, "from an old collector friend."

Nolan, Jim L. writes, " New
Maverick 798 is from Columbus

or 1971D cent: "The Shoe

Box/163 No. High St. Col's, O//221-9222/ "Sammy Grossman\\kmangb." That has catalog no. OH-Col-SH-12. Vic N. writes, "Sammy Grossman, olumbus Ohio."

NE-7(800)20 - Newark Ledger/Lucky Penny/Newark Ledger/Your Lucky Number/B 2022(number incused) 1937D **Newark, NJ, Aqua/Lawniczak/ Zaika, Jim L. writes, "I have just always assumed that the Newark Ledger, Maverick 800, was from New Jersey. Today's Newark Paper is the Star Ledger. This piece is often sold and it is universally attributed to NJ." Al Z. writes, "Newark Ledger, Newark, NJ newspaper, personal knowledge. I sold this newspaper while living in Newark."

Congratulations/J.C. Nicholls Vice-President A & P, 1957D, **Montvale, NJ, Zaika, Al writes, "location of A& P headquarters, as attributed for A & P1 (650)17."

PA-10(802)20 - American Junior Shoes?Paramont Shoe Stores/1227 Good Hope Rd SE, 1960D, *Washington d.C., Reznick, Joe says, "There is a good Hope Road in Wash. D.C."

RI-10(803)20 - Jos.
Rivardo/Appliance-Sports shop/?
address ?/Phone Plaza 1545,
**Detroit, MI, Lawniczak, Jim
writes, "Bob Perdue sent me
maverick 803, the Jos. Rivardo
Appliance piece. It is in my
Michigan catalog as MI-DET-JO10 and I believe is not actually a
maverick but that Detroit, Mich.
is on the piece (that was the
unreadable part). However, the
information I have on the piece is
second hand, so I would
appreciate for the Michigan

catalog any further information from anyone who has this piece."

SE-10(804)20 - Sear's Service Must Shine In '49 Keep Me Shiny, 1946D, **Chicago, Ill, Lawniczak/Zaika, Jim L. writes, " I am going to guess that the Sear's Service piece (804) is probably the Sears department store, which I believe is headquartered in Sears Tower, Chicago, IL. This piece must have come with used cents, there are quite a few different dates known for this piece from the thirties and forties -- well before the "49 on the piece." Al Zaika writes, "Sear's Service, Sears Roebuck, National Headquarters, Chicago, Il, Ref. -Thomas Register of American Manufacturers."

SH-3(805)20 - Shenandoah Valley National Bank/85th Anniversary/ Winchester's Old -Strong Bank, 1950D, **Winchester, VA, Lawniczak/Zaika, Jim writes, " without even leaving my desk here, I can verify no. 805 as Winchester, Virginia. Winchester is in the Shenandoah Valley." Al Z. writes, ref, - 1957 Polk's Bank Directory."

SH-4(806)20 - Shulan's 25 So. Main St./Good For \$1.00 on purchase of \$10.00 & Over. **Akron, OH, Lawnizak, Jim writes, " Maverick No. 806 is from Akron, Ohio and is cataloged in my Ohio encased catalog as (OH)-(AKR)-SH-14. 1 assume the 25 So. Main St. is a typo -- it's actually 85. It is verified by a 1927 piece with the address and Akron, O and by a call I made to Akron public library -- in 1948, Shulan's only store in Akron was at 85 S. Main St."

SM-5(812)20 - Henry P. Smith/Member of Congress. 1970D, **North Tonawanda, NY, Lawniczak, Jim writes, " Maverick 812 is the third piece issued by Smith and is cataloged in my NY catalog as (NY)-(NOT)-SM-14. Here's what I said about the piece in the NY catalog: There was only one Henry P. Smith who was a member of Congress so that absolutely identifies this piece. Henry Smith was born in North Tonawanda in 1911. He attended the public schools and the private Nichols School of Buffalo. He went to law school and practiced law in Ithaca from 1936 to 1941 and then in North Tonawanda until 1961, when he was elected mayor of North Tonawanda. He became a Niagara County judge in 1963. He was elected as a Republican to Congress in 1964 and served from 1964 to 1975, when he voluntarily retired. He died in 1995. Norm Peters told me that he had an office on Oliver Street, whih is a north south street not far from the lake."

SO-9(814)20 - Francis W. Soos/ Dealer in U.S. Coins/1964, **Youngstown, Ohio, Lawniczak/ Reznick, Jim L. writes, "Maverick 814, the Soos piece. There is a 1963D Soos piece, a Fankhauser, Youngstown, Ohio, cataloged by Bryan Ryker as Oh-YOU-SO-10. I have this maverick piece in the Ohio catalog as (OH)-(YOU)-SO-12. Known dates are 1963 and 1964. Joe R. says Soos put out his personal encased and was a member of the AVA.

SQ-2(816)20 -Square Lumber/Talmadge 9-9702, 1948, correction-- not luber ST-21(818)20 - Glenn Straub for County Commissioner, 1962D, **Wheeling, WV, Reznick, Joe says, "based on a 1961 piece that gives city and state."

Stillbrook Whiskey, 1957D,

**NYC, NY, Lawniczak/Zaika,
Jim L. writes, "Maverick 820(the
1957D Stillbrook Whiskey) is the
same company that was the
subject of maverick no. 452 (a
1951-D). It was attributed to
NYC by reference to the Thomas
Register of American
Manufacturers. Both Pieces are
in my NY catalog." Al Z writes,
"NY, NY, ref. Thomas Register
of American Manufacturers.

TE-5(824)20 - Teenie Weenie Children's Shoes, 593 Sutter Ave./ 25 good luck medal's means a pair of shoes free/1926** Brooklyn, NY, Lawniczak/Reznick, Jim L writes, "I suspect that Maverick 824 is from Brooklyn by the address(which is a Brooklyn address) but that's all I know about it." Joe R. agrees that its Brooklyn based on Sutter Ave.

TE-6(825)20 - Terminal Motors/Rambler/2750 W. Lawrence/R.A. 8-1230, 1960D **Chicago, IL Coursel/Reznick/Hoffman Joe R. says that there was a Terminal Theater in Chicago called that because the El-train ends there and Terminal Motors most likely is there as well, Joe's wife grow up four blocks from there. Ralph Coursel sent an ad for Ramblers, Terminal at 2750 W. Lawrence, May 21, 1959, Chicago Daily News. John H. wrote, "This looks like a Chicago address, confirmed that with a big help from Joel Reznick, whose wife apparently came from right near there. Per

Joel this was located near the "terminus" of one of the local elevated train lines (Ravenswood El) hence the name for it and a number of other businesses in the area."

TI-3(826)20 - Representative Silver Award/Time, The Weekly News Magazine/1923-1948\\Time Means Money/ A Quarter Century of News Reporting, 1948 quarter *Chicago or NYC, NY, Lawniczak/Reznick/Zaika, Jim L. writes, " Maverick 826 is very interesting. I actually have the piece in its original mailing box. The box was postmarked, Chciago, Ill., June 17, 1948 and had a return address of; "Time/Incorporated/Agency Division/115 East Ohio Street/Chicago 11, Illinois." If you look carefully at the half dollar and compare it to this medal, you will notice some differences, for example, all on the reverse" 1, the medal has no dot before of after the "Half Dollar" as on the U.S. coin; 2. there are ten stars over E Pluribus Unum on the medal instead of nine on the U.S. coin and 3, the orientation of the four stars to the right of the eagle's head is different. This piece come in a golden or nickel color and sells for \$10 to \$15.

Sid Williams Childrens Shoes, Maverick I.D. by Jim Lawnizak

I just had extraordinary luck in identifying a maverick (not one of yours though) that I thought I'd share it with you and our members. There was a 1957D piece for sale on eBay which reads: "Hood PF Canvas Shoes// Sid Williams Childrens Shoes/ 1478 Hertel Ave.\\ KMANGB.

I identified to piece to Buffalo, N.Y. in about 5 minutes. First I went on the Internet to Altavista.com and did a search for "Hertel Ave." Quite a few entries were found but the first two indicated Buffalo, N.Y., so I immediately switched over to the Yahoo map service and asked Yahoo to show me 1478 Hertel Ave., Buffalo, N.Y. Yahoo gave a match, telling me that the address was a Buffalo address and making it worth my while to check further in Buffalo.

I then called the Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society, pressed 5 for library and the kind librarian got out the 1957 Buffalo directory for me and looked under Williams. And there he was -- Sid Williams and wife Belle with the shoe store on 1478 Hertel Ave. and residence at 1394 Amherst St. Apt. 19. And so the piece was verified to Buffalo and will go into the upcoming NY catalog as (NY)-(BUF)-HE-20 (the HE-10 piece is the interesting 1909 Indian piece for the Hens-Kelly Company). I also decided to put in a bid on the piece on eBay but won't know whether I'm the buyer until the auction closes 9/24/00.

I thought fellow A.C.E. members would like a report of the 2000 NATCA Show. Fellow ACE member, Chuck Berger and the Omaha Coin Club did another fine job of organizing the show. I talked with at least a dozen ACE members at the show. There were a few encasements to be had. The hobby is growing so fast, it is difficult to find nice encasements for your collection. I thought I would build a year date collection of encasements. Before the show started I needed the 1918, 1921, 1987, 1990, and 1992. I was able to add the 1918 & 1921 dates to my collection, so if any of you have encasements with 1987, 1990, and 1992 in them, I would be interested in obtaining them. Early in the show, I talked with Randy Patin and Tony Chibbaro at their table. Tony had some encasements made to advertise for South Carolina Tokens. These encasements were round 45mm with the different state quarters in them. I thought they were great encasements. Tony had the first 8 state quarters encased. One added high light of these cncasements was the misspelling of Tony's last name. The encasements say Tony Chibbard. (Tony plans to continue having the state encasements made)

Jerry Binsfeld is doing a great job of keeping ACE running. At the ACE business meeting the subject of dues was voted on. To keep ACE in the black and to be able to print larger newsletters, it was voted to raised dues to \$15 a year. I feel this is still a bargain considering how much information is in each issue of "The Casement." Another topic of conversation was a rarity guide. As everyone knows in the field of exonumia, rarity guides are a hot topic. There are many different opinions on rarity guides, but the club decided to adopted the EV system (estimated value). As this rarity system is not perfect, at least it will be a start for collectors to have some ideas on what encasements are worth.

The 2001 NATCA show will again be in Omaha, so mark your calendars for September 1 – 2, 2001.

There is an interesting story that goes along with the maverick piece, 1949D, L. & G. Laikin/ House of Service Est. 1914// [phone]/ Elec. [hole] Supplies piece that was recently sold on eBay for a mere \$5.24. When I saw the piece, I thought it might be a NY piece appropriate for inclusion in the NY catalog, and I was already in NYC under Yahoo, so I asked Yahoo to tell me what nearby businesses were "Laikin." And there, in Hoboken NJ was a company called L & G Laikin. So I called the number and talked to the owner who confirmed that Laikin was an electrical supply company and was founded in 1914. It was now and always had been in Hoboken. So this is a NJ piece. The current owner was very interested in the 1949 advertising token for his company and asked me about it. He had no previous knowledge about encased coins or that this token existed. I told him it was still up for auction on eBay, and he turned out to be the high bidder. So an encased coin has gone home after 51 years.

JUST ENCASED.....COLLECTING LUCKY COINS by Chris Boyer sent in by Robert Landry from

Canadian Coin News

Whether you call them lucky coins, souvenir pieces, or encased coins, these novelty items are a relatively inexpensive yet interesting line of numismatic collectible. This article will examine a few encased coins and talk about their composition, purpose and variety.

An encased coin is a regular coin that has been placed into the center of an outer ring, usually composed of aluminum or other material like plastic, which bears a legend of some kind. The legend may be to advertise, to commemorate, to act as a souvenir, or simply bear a personal message. Coins of Canada, the United States, and Great Britain are some of the pieces used in encased coins, but U.S. Lincoln head cents are probably the most commonly found.

The accompanying illustration shows a 1963 Canadian silver 10-cent coin in the center of a ring bearing the motto AMERICAN MUSEUM OF ATOMIC ENERGY-NEUTRON IRRADIATED. Both coin and ring are encased in an aluminum housing covered by a clear plastic window. Most encased coins, however, are composed simply of the aluminum outer ring surrounding the coin, usually a cent, although other denominations are known (e.g. Buffalo nickel). The illustration of the "Forsyth" lucky coin illustrates the use of a 1922 British farthing in an aluminum outer ring bearing the legend SHIRTS-CRAVATS-PAJAMAS. The outer ring need not always be circular in shape. Illustrated at bottom left is a 1956-D Lincoln cent in the form of a horseshoe, synomous with good luck. Other shapes, such as the outline of a bell, are also known.

Just why would someone go to the trouble of having an encased coin made? Since the aluminum-encased versions require striking by a die by firms like Mintage Masters of Kewaunee, Wisconsin (which sets the coin firmly in the center of the ring) it would therefore be necessary to strike a quantity of these pieces. Souvenir encased coins as well as advertising coins are probably the most common usage of these items. Banks, businesses, and even numismatic firms have used these pieces as an advertising medium. Souvenir encased coins have been known for the City of Washington, DC, for example, or the Pan-American Exposition in Buffalo in 1991. In terms of a Canadian example, we looked earlier at the "Eaton's" encased cents, which were available in quantity up to the early 1950s. Some took to dislodging the cent form the center in order to spend the coin at face value. In so doing, the coin often bore the results of the encasing process, with rim damage and distortion. At the O.N.A. 2000 Convention in Toronto recently, intact Eaton's encased cents were changing hands for the \$20. A pretty good return for a one-cent coin!

A few individuals have also chosen to have their own personal encased coins issued. {{The horseshoe-shaped encased cent in the photograph was issued by R.P. Zloger, Justice of the Peace, which is an unusual item, to say the least.}}} Encased coins continue to be issued at the present times, such as by a prominent collector of train-related numismatics in Masury, Ohio.

Coin clubs, too, have issued encased cents recently as part of their anniversary celebrations. For example, North Dakota's Red River Valley Coin Club is issuing a 1960-dated Lincoln encased cent to commemorate its 40th annual show and sale. The reverse bears

the legend KEEP ME AND NEVER GO BROKE and is available for U.S. \$3 each or two for U.S. \$5. To order, contact the club with a SASE and payment to RRVCC, c/o Leonard D. Otterson, 1318 9th Ave. S., Fargo, ND 58103-2506. The Corn Belt Coin Club of Illinois has issued a 50th anniversary encased cent, shaped like a horseshoe and bearing a 1950-dated Lincoln cent. Uncirculated versions can be had for U.S. each, circulated at U.S. \$1.50. Orders, including payment and a SASE can be sent to CBCC, Box 24, Bloomington, IL 61702, USA.

Where can you obtain other encased coins for your collection? There are a few dealers who have a small quantity of these items at shows, and it is often a matter of good fortune if your find them. Dealer "junk boxes" and even antique and flea markets may have encased coins, although this too, is a matter of good fortune.

Are there other collectors of encased coins out there? Certainly, although such collectors of "exonumia" are probably relatively small in number.

While there is no organized club for collectors of encased coins, the Token and Medal Society (T.A.M.S) is a fine organization dedicated to exonumists.

A scholarly and informative article appeared in the April 1999 TAMS Journal by James M. Lawniczak entitled Encased Cents of the Pan American Exposition, which is commended to your reading. Membership in the T.A.M.S is U.S. \$25 and inquiries can be directed to: T.A.M.S Inc., 9230 S. W. 59 Street, Miami, FL 33173, USA.

This collector got "hooked" on encased cents when a fellow Waterloo Coin Society member named Erich brought his collection of encased cents to club meetings and mall displays. Who knows? Maybe your, too, will find enjoyment in collecting these unusual and fascinating numismatic items.

Buy Codes by Todd J. Hagens

As I continue to get deeper and more serious into coin and exonumia collecting I have noticed that many dealers and collectors alike use codes for keeping track of their buy prices. It seems to make sense for when one goes to trade or sell its nice to have an exact cost of the pieces that you intend to sell or trade. I always think I am going to remember what I paid but in reality it doesn't happen thus the importance of a code.

Usually the codes are in letter form and are put on the 2x2's that house the coin or token. The codes are in various places on the 2x2 and sometimes the owner even uses different colored ink. Most use a word or words that use ten letters. Sometimes its their full name. Each letter represents a number 1 to 10. Example: Tod J Hagens. The "T" is used for one, "O" is for 2 and so fourth with "S" representing the 0. If an encased was purchased for \$6.00. The code would be a.ss or a. As you can see sometimes the code can spell out a word. Hopefully your code doesn't send you many subliminal messages like this example. (Perhaps the buy was a poor one and the purchaser was an ass for buying it.) Another example, a Teddy Bear encased was purchased for \$350.00. The code then would be dhs.ss or dhs.

Some guys get so good that they can add and subtract with their code. Some will add decoy letters such as x or z in front or in the back of the code. (x)a.ss or (z)a. or dhs.ss(x) or (x)dhs. The decoy letter makes it a little more difficult to break the code. However, most could care less what the owner paid but rather what the ask price is and whether or not the price represents a fair market value. Again, the code is more for the owner to keep an accurate record.

One collector friend uses the first 10 letters of the alphabet as his buy code. A=1, B=2, C=3, D=4, E=5, F=6, G=7, H=8, I=9 and J=0. If an item was bought for \$6.00 the code would be F or F.JJ. If a coin was bought for \$350, the code would be CEJ or CEJ.JJ. Another coin club member uses the last 10 letters of the alphabet. Q=1,R=2,S=3,T=4,U=5, V=6,W=7,X=8,Y=9 and Z=0. He also uses additions and subtractions as a decoy. If he paid \$6.00 for one encased his code would be V or V.ZZ or QZ-T (10-4=6). If he paid .75 for a good for or trade token, his code would be .wu or wu. As you can see their are many possibilities. Perhaps you already have a system of keeping track of your cost and if not the above are some ideas for you to consider.


Holes in Encased by Jim Lawniczak

What Constitutes an Encased Coin - M. Allen

I believe an encased coin is any coin that is encased within and surrounded by another material such as aluminum, paper, cardboard, brass, plastic, wood, vulcanite, copper, nickel, silver, gold and where it was made to hold the coin with some degree of permanence. A coin or token that is merely resting in a glass covered jar obviously would not be classified as an encased coin but one made to rest in a permanent bottle or in a clear block of lucite would be.

A coin or coins that is housed in a cardboard holder and is made for that purpose is considered an encased coin by the above definition. The popular quarter map, Whitman folder and encapsulated third party graded coin is an encasement. The same is true for the the proof set, Susan B. Anthony, Ike Dollar or .999 round that is housed in a plastic container which is complete with a label and cardboard holder. This however is where the encased collector would most likely draw the line and would not wish to have that conglomeration in their encased collection. Generally speaking an advertisement, a city and state or something descriptive within the holder makes it desirable. Low on the pecking order would be the pictured bicentennial set. It is a type of encasement but again not what the encased collector desires. On the other hand, high on the encased collector's want list would be the pictured encased Indian cents displayed in a heavy stocked paper with advertisement from a by gone era. The Susan B. Anthony dollar housed in a similar holder with a clever ad slogan would also be collectible but obviously less desirable because of the age factor. The Indian cents example most likely is very rare and may be one of only a few examples that survived. So, supply and demand is also a big factor to the encased collector.

The Susan B. housed in a flip complete with bank advertisement would not be considered an encased coin mainly because it is free floating. The pictured sticker dollar is not an encasement because it is not surrounded and held by another material. These two examples may be desirable collecting items and fall into the area of exonumia but not specially encased.

A type coin made to fit within another larger type coin is an encased according to the above definition. Some disagree and feel that the coin within a coin that is hand made lacks the permanence definition.




