A person from Numismatic News wrote and declined stating there was not enough collector base to make the project worthwhile. House of Collectibles never gave a reply which I guess means a no. piece. He based his identification
on the fact that Superior & Clinton
is a major intersection in Ft.

there, though no other reference

was used. I am continuing to
check on this piece and will report
any progress."

lot of imagination to see that
Glessco is a shortened version for
Glessner Co."

relates the following, "Priester's
Park-this was a sub-division of St.
Louis, Mo. It was apparently a
popular place during the early
1900's. Here is some information I
have "borrowed" from the internet.
"Hashagen's began as a picnic
grounds in the nineties and later
became an amusement park with
an auto race track, at which time it
was known as Priester's Park. It
was also the scene of balloon
ascensions in the early 1900's.
There was very little subdivision
activity in the area after 1930, one
of the last being Pomona Court in
1942. A large area of apartments
was developed in the vicinity of
Spring Avenue and Delor Street
during the 1960's."

The wording is similar and the date is only 2 years apart. It seems a likely match "

JO-4(706)18 - Josam/ Plumbing Drainage Products/ Standard of the World, 1948-S, hs - **Michigan City, IN, Perdue, Bob writes, "Josam Plumbing was identified as being from Michigan City, IN Maverick #369 is a typo and should read Josam not Jusam. In as much as these pieces have the name Josam and the word plumbing on them I'll venture a guess that they're both from the same place "

PA-10(802)20 - American Junior Shoes / Paramount Shoe Stores/1227 Good Hope Rd SE\\ kmangb, 1960-D, rd **Washington D.C., Crow, Harry writes, "Listed in the 1941 Wash. D.C. Directory at 1225 Good Hope Road S E and a dress shop at 1227. This is the latest Washington D.C. Directory I have "

St-23(821)20 - Good Luck /Red Stallton/Eagle Lion Films. 1947, hs, *L A. or Hollywood, CA, Perdue, Bob shares this, "I suspect this is a typo and should read good luck/Red Stallion. Red Stallion is a western movie that was released in 1947 by Eagle

Lion Films It was 81 minutes long and starred Robert Paige I can't find any address for the studio, but it was surely in L.A., or Hollywood, CA. I hope someone can take this additional info and identify this piece "

Fr-6(848)21 - W E Frazier/Coal, Wood, Feed and Building Materials/1319-21 11th St. S.E., 1904 Chamberpot, **Washington D.C., Crow, Harry writes, "is listed at this address in the 1900 Washington D.C. Directory as W. Edward Frazier."

MA-18(857)21-1929 50th 1979/ Martin Funeral Home/Oak ridge/LaFollete/Lake City/ Clinton, 1979, hs **TN, Crow, Harry writes, "is listed in the 1960 Morticians Dir. in all three towns in TN except LaFollete which is also in TN."

PU-3(860)21 - "Thank You" Publix Cab Tabor 0111\\ kmaywhgl ** Denver, CO, Zervas, Jim, "writes that it is Denver and that he ID it once before." (quite possible, on more than one occasion the editor has listed pieces under different letters. This piece could be PU or CA, much like grading coins, one day its MS-63 and the next its a 64. Several Aces have stated this, Bob Perdue will sort this out in his Maverick catalog)

The very next day, the lady brought some from her home, one of which was this encased. I found it listed in a New Castle, PA. Telephone Directory. She lives in New Castle and got it from there. Jim L. writes, "I have one of these in my collection and about 6 months ago I noticed an ad from the Realtor. It is located in Amarillo, Texas and still in business I talked to Hugo Loewenstern and he verified that it is their encasement and that they have been at that location about 50 years Mr Loewenstern told me personally that they had issued a couple of other dates of these encasements He did not say for sure but I assume they were in the

50's also "

There are two pieces made by this club, this is the first one I have cataloged it as the (NY)-WWI-WE-10, and here is what I have to say about it in the New York catalog. I had purchased one of these West Windsor Coin pieces from a New Yorker, and therefore suspected that the West Windsor might be the one from New York (there are also West Windsors in Maine and Michigan) So, I put a call in to a coin shop in Binghamton, Iroquois Numismatics. The numismatist there remembered the West Windsor Coin Club and thought that it was founded around the mid 60s. He put me in touch with the

founder, Walt Riker, who still lives in West Windsor. I called Walt and he remembered making the two encased for the club's first two coin shows. The club was founded in 1963 and went out of business in the 1980s. The second piece is cataloged as (NY)-WWI-WE-12. Here is the information on it from the New York catalog: 1966, H. West Windsor Coin/Club\\Second Coin Show//April 8/ 1967. The obverse die is a different die than the -10 although the words are the same. The letters are noticeably larger on this piece than on the -10.

They branched out to many smaller communities in Utah, Idaho, Arizona and Wyoming in the late 1880's and 1890's. Most of the smaller branches have closed but they still have branches in larger cities in this area. Their corporate headquarters has always been Salt Lake City."

Beware of Soft Plastic Flips

from Jim Lawniczak

I have one piece of vital
information to share with
everyone. Stop Saving your
encased in soft plastic flips! I have
been getting all kinds of encased
pieces recently with green
corrosion starting on them. In
some cases, it can be gotten out
with Acetone or with MS 70 Coin
Brightener (good for getting

corrosion off of copper but don't
let it touch aluminum - it turns the
aluminum an unnatural color) If
the corrosion starts to eat into the
metal, you still have to stop it to
keep the piece from getting worse,
but it will be permanently marked
I think a lot of hobbyists who buy
pieces to trade later for pieces they
really want keep their pieces in the
original packing materials and that
is a mistake if it's the soft plastic
flips.

Something new, they may be called Coin Cards, Money Cards, Window Cards, Souvenir Cards, Collector Cards or Encased Coins. The Royal Canadian mint has been making Collector Coin Cards since 1999 Two of these cards have been advertised in Canadian Coin News (CCN), Jan 23, 2001 issue by Colonail Acres Coins Canadian Coins are located in Kitchner, Ontario, Canada and have a toll free phone number which is 1-888-255-4565 One is a 2000 Loon \$1.00 Millennium Card which sells for \$3.15 U.S. funds and the other is a 2000 \$2.00 Knowledge Card which sells for \$3.47 U.S. They are the size of credit cards, with the coin laminated normally in the middle of the card with both sides showing. By definition I would classify them as encased coins. What do ACE members think?

I don't believe you can buy these cards directly from the Canadian Mint so its hard to really know how many different pieces have been made. Currently I have a July 1999 Millennium 25 cent

card, a Dec 1999 Millennium 25 cent card, a 12 coin set of 2000 Millennium quarters, the 2000 Loon dollar and the 2000 \$2.00 Knowledge card.

The two cards from Colonial Acres Coins and postage costs about \$10.12 U.S. The encased quarters are more difficult to locate.

Maverick Index Project

Bob Perdue has begun a maverick index project which was endorsed by the members at the last ACE Central States meeting. Terry Cross, ACE #107 addresses this very concern on the next pages of The Casement. Terry is right on when he states that if it is already contemplated, then chalk it to great minds thinking alike. The Kl aus golden Anniversary piece has been identified as being from

Chicago and Lebanon, PA. This could be another regional type piece, and only the headquarters would need to be determined.

A PROPOSAL FOR AN ENCASEMENT RARITY GUIDE By Rudy Gilberti

I believe it is a positive move forward to adopt the NATCA ev scale for encased valuation. However as we all know value at times can bear no relationship to rarity. Accordingly I would propose incorporating a simplified rarity guide, which when used in conjunction with the ev categories would provide the encased collector with a more precise tool for evaluating pieces in his/her collection.

Having read all past issues of The Casement, I am aware of former discussion regarding a rarity guide, and agree that the standard categories of R1-R7 or R8 are extremely problematic. Especially when there is also the attempt to estimate surviving population of a certain issue. Even in the most researched series such as colonials and Large cents, population estimates are under constant revision. To say 10 or less of a certain encasement are known to exist is in my opinion virtually impossible and misleading to the beginning collector. Just witness the flood of new and unlisted encasement varieties that appear on Ebay each week. I propose a simple 4 tier system which I believe can be easily utilized for the collector/catalogers of any state. No estimates on number known, just simple and to the point:

R1 common: These are the varieties which have historically appeared repeatedly on almost every dealer's price list and are auctioned on ebay each week. For my state of NY this would be the Stork series and merchants whose encased were issued more than once with different date cents and encasement die varieties. Each state surely has these issues which can be identified as the most common.

R2 scarce: I firmly believe that this category makes up the largest population of encased for almost any state. If a merchant placed an order in 1950 for 1000 encased, the surviving population today would surely still be considered scarce. This category would include most merchants who ordered a single run of encased and perhaps the lesser known souvenir pieces.

R3 rare: Here I would place the off-metal, odd shaped, denominations other than cents and most good for encasements. These are the issues you only see appearing for sale perhaps once a year or less.

R4 extremely rare/ possibly unique: I think any beginning collector of a particular state quickly becomes aware of which varieties would be included in this rarity bracket. Celluloid encasements from a remote low population town, heart shaped and teddy bears would be likely candidates for this elite category.

There you have it. A simple system which I am certain any collector or state cataloger could apply to a collection or future catalog. This rarity guide utilized in conjunction with the newly adapted NATCA ev scale would bring a more structured overall evaluation guide which will be welcomed by both the beginner and advanced collector of encased. I would welcome constructive criticism as to how this proposed idea could be improved or made more useful.

The State Listings

From Terry Cross

I suggest that the listing of attributed mavericks is the MOST valuable aspect of a listing. Knowing what may be out there from a given town or state is interesting, but the benefit of not duplicating research on mavericks is more valuable.

I would hope that the last volume of the state listings (or a separate volume if necessary) would include a comprehensive listing of all of attributed mavericks included in the state listings. It could be more, but it may be just one line with the key words and ref. to the town and state. One can then go to the individual state list to get whatever additional detail and attribution authority there may be.

Without a comprehensive list, when faced with a maverick, you may have to go through all 50 lists before you know if it is attributed or not.

A comprehensive listing of mavericks may not be manageable if the state cataloguers don't supply separate listings of the mavericks within their lists. However, if each state lister provides an electronic listing (by email or supplying a computer disk) of the mavericks from his/her state indexed along the same lines as mavericks are indexed for the Casement, then the comprehensive list would merely require tedious but manageable sorting/cutting/pasting. If you agree and extract this info from the listers in electronic format, I'm willing to undertake the aforementioned sorting etc. I view this as a manageable undertaking because I (or whoever else does it) can do it in stages by receiving the mavericks for Book 1 and making a master and then weaving in the mavericks from Book 2 etc. as we go. The final maverick list won't be available until the maverick lists for the last book are provided and integrated into the master.

Let me know what you think. It probably can't be done without cooperation from the state listers. However, if the listers for the "big" states complied with the request, a certain amount of keystrokes to input the mavericks from a few state lists (including those where you are the default lister) would not be fatal to the process.

If this is already contemplated, then chalk it to great minds thinking alike.

Finally, I have assumed that each state lister will include in their state listings all mavericks previously attributed to their state in the Casement's maverick attribution section. But with listing duties being assumed by new members, maybe they don't have access to all old Casements? It would be a shame for a final state listing to omit a maverick that was authoritatively attributed in the Casement.

TEXAS ENCASED COINS

This listing is an initial attempt to identify all known Texas encased coins. Reading from the top to the bottom, each line is divided by a slash mark (/). The normal obverse, side with the information, is listed first and the reverse side, usually with a standard legend, is listed indented on the second line. For a list of abbreviations of reverse legends see the table below. All lettering is assumed to be raised with a few exceptions. A word both underlined & in bold type will indicate that portion of the description which is incise. A word in bold type only is used for that portion of a description which is printed in ink on the encasement rather than die struck. It will be followed by the color of the ink in parenthesis.

The order for listing the physical description is shape, space if there is no hole and if the encasement was manufactured with a hole then -O- will be noted, then the coin date with mint mark, denomination & coin type, and lastly the material and the size in metric measurements.

The towns are listed in capital letters followed by the county in which the town is located, in italics within parentheses. Encasements with multiple towns will be listed under the first town in the description with a note under the other towns to see the first one for the listing. If an encasement is known but without a complete description the listing is preceded by (AK), which stands for (Also Known). Question marks are used for that part of the description in which the data is not known.

Varieties are determined by a difference in the die strike on the encasement or coin denomination and not by the coin date or mint mark. If there are varieties known for a merchant they will be listed in order of the coin date, if they have been examined or as (Other varieties known) if a complete description isn't known. When different date coins are reported for the same example the dates will be listed in parentheses under the listing. Because pennies can be replaced and older pennies used in production, this will also be noted in parenthesis under known or suspected examples. Mavericks will be verified from city directories or phone books before being listed in the published listing with a few exceptions. Those exceptions are if they have a very strong possibility of being from Texas but adequate reference material is not available to verify it. These will be noted as a tentative attribution. There is an index to known mavericks at the end. If you have Texas encased coins that are not found here, I would like to have a description so that it can be included in this listing. If it is a maverick, I would also like to know the source you used to attribute it. You will be helping all collectors by doing so.
