New Maverick Listing

Send your maverick information to **Bob Perdue**. (See his article elsewhere in this issue.) his emails are listed above and his address: **3215 Hardacre Ct., New Castle, IN 47362** Members quite often inquire about purchasing listed mavericks. This is only possible if the owner submits the piece(s) to the club auction. Remember you can put minimum bids and if not realized your piece or pcs will be returned.

Mavericks are numbered and grouped with the first two letters of the surname or major topic. Each letter group will have its own set of numbers and each piece will also be numbered

according to the order listed. The issue number will follow the order number. Also the state will be indicated as to where the maverick was submitted from, this will help the attributing detectives. (Any starting clue may be helpful-see Bob Perdue's letter where this suggestion was made and implemented.)

A maverick has no indication of town and/or state. Members are encouraged to attribute and elaborate on their conclusion with personal accounts and reference used.

One small change I'm suggesting is the use of the two letter State Abbreviation to begin the new mavericks with. This would be the State that the maverick is submitted from I think often times location is the key to identification and this should be helpful. Whatever method you decide to use I will pick up on this end and submit future pcs that way.

I will support whatever decision you make, but if you intend to convert all of the States listing to Excel format you are getting in to a lot of work. I'm poor typist, but it took me an entire weekend just to add the Fankhauser mavericks to my index. If you were to set on top of each other CA, PA, and NY catalogs you would have several months work in those alone. You might what to reconsider and have each State cataloger submit a floppy with their States on them. This would be so much easier and would allow for individualiyt that some use. The footnotes in the CA catalog give

a lot of information that the readers would like. As I say I will support what you decide but you may be getting into a bigger job than you think. Let me know when you need the next column by and I'll get it in with time to spare. There are actually several more pcs identified that can be used. I have a good description of the thirteenth, but the last one (Snellenburg) I only know of from the original listing "The Casement" so am unsure as to the exact description. I have listed it here as it appeared in the original listing.

Using the rarity guide proposed by Rudy Gilberti, I have pencilled in rarities and a value range which would reflect the condition of the piece. In summary it looks like this:

R1 \$3 - \$5
R2 \$30-\$60
R3 \$60-\$100
R4 \$100 - \$200

This is based on my experience with Delaware encased.

I've noticed that many times people will ask questions in their letters, or talk about things that you could add to. I wonder if you would consider using an Editor's Note periodically to either answer questions or

comment on different things people write? Sometimes a note from you might update all of us on an ongoing project, or maybe clarify something that happened at a meeting, or possibly tell us something we didn't know about Wisconsin encased.

I really enjoyed meeting Jim Lawniczak earlier this year. He has done such an excellent job cataloging the Ohio and Michigan encased. Now he's tackling New York?! Oh my. Having done one catalog myself, we had a lot in common to talk about.

I have also been in touch with Bob Perdue. What a job on the maverick listing. It has been fun brainstorming ideas on how to go about it.

Periodically throughout the year I get e-mails from people asking whether anyone is still making encased coins today. Usually they find me through my web site and see the ones I did for our local coin club. Sometimes they ask me to help them design their pieces.

He stated that to complete the test I should touch nine(9), zero(0), the pound sign (#), and then hang up. Luckily, I was suspicious and refused.

Upon contacting the telephone company, I was informed that by pushing 90#, you give the requesting individual full access to your telephone line, which enables him/her to place long distance calls billed to your home phone number. I was further informed that this scam has been originating from many local jails/prisons. I have also verified this information with UCB Telecom, Pacific Bell, MCI, Bell Atlantic and GTE. Please beware. DO NOT press 9, 0 # for ANYONE. The GTE Security Department requested that I share this information with EVERYONE I KNOW. If you have mailing lists and/or newsletters from organizations you are connected with, I encourage you to pass on this information to them, too. After checking with Verizon they said it was true, so do not dial (9), zero(0), the pound sign # and hang up, for anyone.

Nevada's First Encased Coin

(From a Dec. 1977 TAMS Journal)



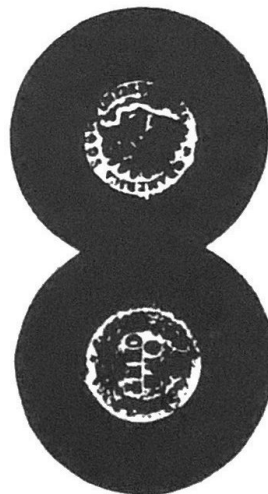
Nevada's first known encased coin was issued by First National Bank of Rhyolite in 1909. The piece is unique to Nevada banking, as no other bank in the state, before or since, is known to have issued encased coins, bank tokens or medals. A few state chartered banks did provide their customers with serially numbered "lost and found" key tags, and more recently, silver bank ingots have been issued on behalf of several institutions. The encased coin is in a round aluminum frame and contains a 1909 Lincoln cent. The obverse of the

piece carried a portentous message to the depositors of First National Bank:

Obv: KEEP ME AND NEVER GO BROKE

Rev: FIRST NATIONAL BANK / RHYOLITE / NEVADA

Where to get Encased Made from Phil Bressett, ACE #50

This question is asked quite often by coin club and ACE members. The only place that I

know is Mintage Masters, Inc. a subsidiary of Hi-Tech Graphics Inc. The factory is located in Kewaunee, Wisconsin which is a small town in the heart of Packer country just north of Green Bay. The person to contact who can give quotes and answer questions of perspective customers is Linda Polzin who resides at P.O. Box 147 N6688 High Point Road, Juneau, WI 53039. Phone 800-238-3117, fax -920-356-9249. Lead time for delivery is 4-6 weeks. Terms are 1/2 prepay and balance when delivered. Prices quoted FOB Kewaunee. Die Charges for encased cents run about \$340-\$365 pending number of characters. Cost is slightly more for encased quarters. (The used die can be obtained by request and is free except for postage-this could be another collectible in the field of encased) The slogan side is provided by HT. Production cost for horseshoe encased cents is about \$500 for a quantity of 1000 and more for quarters. So for about \$900 a club can make 1000 cent encased.

The second question that is asked quite often is, "What are the different shapes and styles that Hi-Tech can make for encased? The answer, " round and horseshoe for cents and with or without a hole and with or without a key chain." Encased quarters are made with round collars only.

The third question that is asked, "Are there any other places that make encased? The answer is no unless some ACE knows where and if so would they be so kind as to share the information with club members via The Casement.

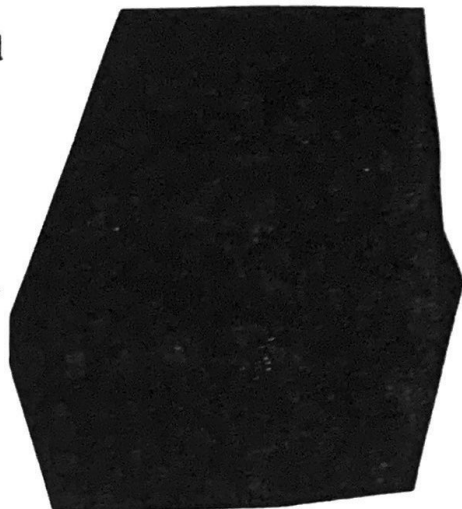
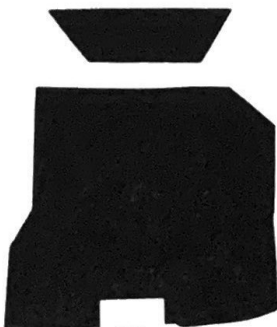

The one I have in my collection is a 1952D.

So, it looks like this encased came with a birthday card, probably one for every customer whose birthday they knew.

Somehow money has been adapted to many different uses other than just a medium of trade. People have endowed coins with superstitious connections.

Encased coins, with their standard inscription of "Keep me and have good luck," are just another manifestation of superstitions relating to money.

Superstition and belief in luck seems to have existed since the creation of man. This is likely because people always seek to explain mysterious phenomena. If one not explain some seemingly random misfortune, just chalk it up to bad luck. Likewise, people reason, one can somehow influence his or her luck, either by observing certain practices or keeping certain items, such as coins.

Many superstitions are related to coins. When a person finds a cent sitting on the sidewalk, if it is heads-up or marked with the person's birth date, then that person should pick it up and keep it as a good luck charm.

To decide some questions, such as what football team will have the ball first, a coin is flipped. People allow random chance, or luck, to determine the course of action.

Coins are a part of many ceremonies as well. According to tradition, a bride should carry a coin in her shoe to bring good luck and prosperity upon her new family. In ancient Greek mythology, coins were put over the eyes of the dead. The coins served two purposes: first, they held down the eyelids; and second, they were toll for 'he ferry into the Underworld'.

Encased coins are almost the epitome of this tradition of

superstitious connections to coins. Many encased coins carry multiple symbols of good luck. They carry the legend "Keep me and have good luck." Many encasements also depict four-leaf clovers and horseshoes-in fact some encasements are in the shape of a horseshoe.

These symbols and promises of good luck, of course, were intended to entice people to keep them for a long period of time and thus carry around a constant advertisement for the issuer.

At any rate, encased coins represent a basic human need: knowledge that some higher power is on our side of life. Thus encased coins, like all numismatic items, are another manifestation of practices and beliefs in human civilization.

FANKHAUSER FUN

Fankhauser Fun is a column featuring stories and new information about Fankhauser encased coins. I'm always looking for interesting bits of information about Fankhauser pieces. Sometimes just a little story or memory about a place or a person brings a piece to life.

This time I would like to report about a "new" Pennsylvania Fankhauser piece. Actually it is an old Fankhauser piece, but I've just learned that it is from Pennsylvania. I'm talking about: GOOD SAMARITAN HOSPITAL // STREET FAIR (1961D cent)

There is no Good Samaritan Hospital in Fort Wayne. The nearest one we could find is in Vincennes, Indiana, so that is where we attributed this piece at the time of the book in 1995.

In July 1996 a friend wrote to me that he had this piece and had the words "Lebanon, PA" lightly scratched into the aluminum. I called the hospital, found out the name of the president and wrote to him asking whether they held a street fair back around 1961. He never wrote back, and I let it go.

Then a month or two ago I heard from a different friend. He lives in Lebanon County, PA. He found one of these pieces locally. He told me that the Good Samaritan Hospital in Lebanon has had a street fair for the past 50 years. We talked about how to verify that they were the ones who had this piece made, and eventually he got in contact with Joyce Dessinger, The Director of Community Relations. She contacted the women who was Street Fair Chairman in 1961, and yes, she remembered having a souvenir encased piece made as part of the fair promotion that year.

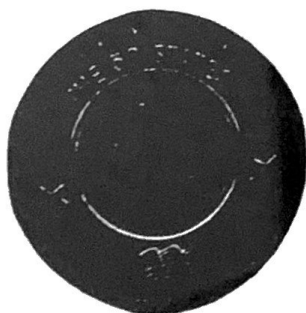

Mavericks by Bob Perdue

Greetings to all With this issue I have taken over the responsibility of being the maverick editor for THE CASEMENT. It is not with a lot of experience that I enter this position. I have only been collecting encased for about 3 years. My desire to contribute was fueled by my ordering all of the back issues of THE CASEMENT. I started to see how this was a club that was originally formed by a core group of collectors with a common interest. This club has rapidly grown to the point where it has become difficult for one person to keep up with the demands. I could imagine Jerry having to take time away from his family and personal life to attend to the duties of the club. It is in this vein that I have volunteered for this job. It is not because I have extreme knowledge or experience. I would ask the patience and cooperation of all members to be effective.

In working on the maverick index several concerns have arisen. I hope to address these in future issues. In this initial introduction I would just like to point out the importance of submitting accurate information. It is very frustrating to waste time trying to research mavericks where the spelling and or the address's are incorrect. If you are submitting encased for identification please be sure to double-check your spelling and other information on the encased. It is also important to provide all of the information included on the encased. If you are unsure how to write a description refer to one of the excellent examples in the State's listings in back issues.

Email is the preferred method of contacting me. This saves both parties time and expense. You may email me at bperdue@nlc.net or beeperdo@hotmail.com. Please don't send scans or rubbings via email unless there is a very good reason to do so. If writing by mail my address is included in each issue of THE CASEMENT. If you would like a return reply please include a SASE.

A final note on the maverick index. I'm still plodding along on this. I suspect we have about 2500 encased listed on it. If you are a State cataloger and haven't submitted your State's mavericks please take the time to do so. When this is finished hopefully it will benefit all of our members. There will be more on this in future issues.

FA-1 (50) 2- A correction from last month. While Fairbanks Morse had what must have been a very large production facility in Beloit, WI it was not its headquarters. Rulau Chi 56 is a token from Fairbanks Morse and is identified from Chicago. There is also an online Fairbanks museum that plainly lists Chicago as the headquarters. Stay tuned this will not be the last mistake yours truly makes.

BE-21 (929) 23 - Berger and Silver Jewelers - Cleveland, Ohio** - Terry Stahurski. I found an AJ Berger listed under "Retail Jeweler" in my 1953-54 Cleveland Directory (East Suburbs). The store is listed at 13941 Cedar. In addition, Edward I. Silver is listed as a jeweler with Berger's Jewelers in the same directory. These two men must have been partners sometime before or after 1954. My guess is that this occurred sometime in the 1960's, as the telephone number is all numerals and lacking the alphabetical suffix used in earlier phone numbers.

HI-1 (30) Elect Secretary of State / John Hill Governor - Texas** - Terry Cross. Terry is unsure of the years of the campaign, but is sure he ran and lost. Dan Agler also identified this in the Texas State listings.

MI -1 (31) Minyard's / Your Friendly Grocer - Dallas, Texas** - Terry Cross. Terry states that they are still in operation and have a web site. This was also identified to Dallas in the Texas listing by Dan Agler.

WF -1 (458) 12 - WFAA Early Birds - Dallas, Texas** - Terry Cross - A current CBS affiliate. Dan Agler also identified this in the Texas State listing.

BR-9 (621) 16 - Brady - Garrick Chevrolet / 4530 Archer - Chicago, IL** - Ebay lot # 1253865556 is an identified encased from this dealer.

FO-4 (491) 13 - Ford Rent CO - Dallas, Texas** - Dan Agler - I have a 1925 Dallas Telephone Co. telephone book & found them listed at 1307 Commerce St. with 2 phone numbers, X-6464 &

X-3366 They advertised a 50-cent Taxi service. I guess Southwestern Bell must have taken them over by 1927 or they changed their exchange prefixes by then, one or the other. Dan would appreciate it if the person that submitted this piece contact him so that he may get a complete description for his Texas listings.

CA-10 (279) 9 - Garden's Confectionary / 315 Gay St - Knoxville, TN** - Zaika / Moffit - This was actually identified on page 16 of issue 23. I guess no one knew this was an ACE maverick. I hope someone will send in the source for the identification.

DI-3 (220) 7 - Dickinson Trust Company - Richmond, IN** In issue #23 I had some preliminary information on the possibility of this being from Richmond, IN. Here is the documentation. The following information is from Doris Ashbrook of the Morrison - Reeves Library of Richmond, Indiana. The Dickinson Trust Co. was founded in 1899. According to Richmond city directories, it was located at 32 South 8th Street from 1899 to 1914. This site had originally been the site of the Meredith House Hotel. In 1908 it merged with the Richmond Trust Co. In August 1914, Dickinson Trust announced they were razing the existing structures and building a new building on the northeast corner of 8th and Main Streets. This would have given them a front directly on Main and would have been cat-a-corner from their original location just south of Main on the west side of 8th Street. This address was a little over half way down the block towards South A Street. The structure has been long gone. Sometimes in the city directories the new address is given as 800 or 802 East Main, but usually the designation "NE corner of 8th & Main" was used. This was a large imposing structure and is still standing and still a bank today. Currently, it is the central Richmond office of Firststar Bank. Dickinson Trust did not escape financial troubles and pecuniary scandals. You will be able to get an overview of this from scanning the bibliography. The Trust retired from commercial banking in 1934 and was completely absorbed into Second National Bank and out of business by 1944. Second National Bank, in turn, was decades later sold to Star Bank and Star Bank merged with another bank and is now Firststar.

CL-5(316)10- Cleveland & Cook. Ft Wayne, IN** This is another carry over from issue #23. Here is the information on this being from Ft. Wayne; I located the Cleveland & Cook Filling station in the 1938 Fort Wayne City Directory. At that time, it was located at 434 South Clinton, at the intersection of South Clinton and Superior Streets. This is from Delia Bourne of the Ft. Wayne library.

WO-4(461)12- Wolcott Centennial - Wolcott, IN** - In 1858 Anson Wolcott came to this township, purchased land with A.T. Case (3340 acres). On the 15th day of May 1861. Anson Wolcott laid out and platted the town of Wolcott, IN on the Pittsburgh, Chicago and St. Louis Railroad. The Wolcott Centennial - 100 years was celebrated in early summer 1961. Deanna Dreblow, Library Director, Wolcott, IN

TH-2(342)10- Jerry Thornburg / Auditor - Muncie, IN** - Jerry is a career politician in Muncie and Delaware County. He has served in a variety of elected and appointed offices. His current position is director of Community Development in Delaware County.

WK-1(265)8- WKOX / WKOF - Hopkinsville, KY** - - The radio station with both dial settings is listed in "COMMUNICATIONS WORLD" Spring - Summer 1973.

BR-14(626)16 - Brownie's Watch & Jewelry Repair - Alexandria, VA** - There was a Brownie's watch and jewelry repair at that address. The business shows up for the first time in the 1953 City Directory and vanishes after 1972. In 1974 the property is listed as "vacant." George Combs, Research Librarian, Alexandria, VA. As a note. I'm positive I've seen a different Brownie's encased maverick somewhere. I will continue to look and forward the information to Page Mann.

CO-18(639)16- Cousins's Jewelry - Anderson, IN** Cousins appears to have begun in business in about 1928. Its first address was listed as the NW corner of 10th and Meridian. The next year the city directory listed the address as 933 Meridian, which is, I believe, the same thing. At one point in time, it appears to have been an optometry as well. In 1969, the address was listed as 1019 Meridian. Cousins stayed at that location until the 1982 directory. The same address listed "No information" in 1983 and by 1985, a jeweler named Collins and Son is at that address. - Beth Oljace, Anderson Library.

MA-16(733)18- Madison County LBR Co. - Anderson, IN** - Madison County Lumber: According to an article which ran in the 1933 ANDERSON DAILY BULLETIN, the Madison County Lumber Co. was begun in 1901 as the Winters-Mercer-Brannum Company. The name was changed around 1930. At that time, the president was a man named Winters, with members of the Campbell family as the other officers. In 1951, the year of your encased, the Company was located at 1421 Jackson St. and being run by the Campbell family. There is still a Madison County Lumber Company in the 2000 city directory. This is again from Beth Oljace.

HA-5 (94) - Havelock Tobacco - Richmond, VA** 094. I know this will read more like a short story than an attribution, but I actually spent several months trying to run this down and have accumulated a lot of information. Sir Henry Havelock (1795-1857) was a British General. There is a current statue of him on Trafalgar Square. It is from his name that I assume this product takes its name. I began by searching for "Havelock Tobacco" on Ebay and came up with several items related to the business including tobacco cards and tins. These tins all seemed to say "Manufactured by the British American Tobacco Co Proprietary, Limited, Melbourne, Australia". However, they also had advertising phrases such as "Pure Virginia Tobacco", "Finest Growth American Leaf", or "Pure American leaf" on them and most also had the name "Cameron" or "Cameron's Havelock". It made little sense that an Australian Company would make an encased coin with an American cent or advertise itself as being made from "Pure Virginia Tobacco". I was unsure who or what Cameron's was, but began searching for the connection. Once again by using the Ebay search mode I eventually found a tobacco tin from Cameron & Cameron Tobacco Co. in Richmond, Virginia. I contacted the Richmond, Virginia Public Library in writing and was sent excellent documentation on the Cameron Tobacco Co. Liz Triplett compiled this information. I have added information from other sources to her original work. Alexander Cameron was born in Scotland. His family came to America in 1847 and at the age of 13 he began working for the David Dunlop Tobacco Co. of Petersburg, VA. He rose to a level of partnership with this company. In 1858, with his brothers he formed Cameron & Brothers Tobacco Co. In 1889 they expanded the company and formed Cameron & Cameron Tobacco Co. of Richmond, VA. In that same year they also opened an Australian branch and had factories in Melbourne, Adelaide, Sydney, and Brisbane. This business expanded into India and South Africa the expansion was so massive that Alexander Cameron appointed his nephew Alexander Cameron Jr. to head the Australian division of the company. In September 1902 the American Tobacco Company ceased activities in Great Britain and Ireland and the British Tobacco Company abandoned plans to enter the American market except for leaf buying operations. The British Tobacco Company acquired UK rights to the American company's brands and the American Tobacco Company acquired rights in its home market to the British brands. A new company was formed and registered in Britain under the name of British-American Tobacco Company Limited, to which the export and duty free ship stores business of both companies was transferred in exchange for shares in the new company. It is this agreement that I believe gave Cameron the right to market the Havelock brand name in America. This would also explain the use of American advertising slogans on the products while showing the ownership as being in Australia. Also note the encased is dated 1903. The year after this agreement. In 1911 the Supreme Court disbanded the American Tobacco Company as being a monopoly and in violation of the Sherman Act. As a result of this ruling four new companies were formed. These four new companies were to rule the majority of the future American market. Interestingly enough one of these new companies was called the

American Tobacco Company. A flyer from a 1921 trade show called "The Made in Richmond Exposition" has The Cameron Tobacco Co. as being the headquarters for the "British American Tobacco Company, LTD. Richmond branch. The last listing for the Cameron Tobacco Co is in the 1928 city directory, though members of the Cameron family continued to serve in various capacities for other tobacco companies.

New Mavericks;

According to Bryan Ryker there are only 8 unidentified Fankhauser encased left. These would be the first 8 encased listed. A few of these have been run before and identified to Fort Wayne by ACE, but that information was incorrect.
